NEC Football Offensive Player of the Week

Corey Bundy, Sacred Heart

So., WR, 6-0, 180, Selden, NY/Newfield

Bundy, a first-time NEC Offensive Player of the Week winner, caught five passes for 112 yards and two touchdowns (26 and 45 yards) as the Pioneers knocked off previously unbeaten Wagner, 25-17, at Fairfield, CT. Bundy's first touchdown came with 6:05 left in the first half and gave the Pioneers a 9-7 lead. The sophomore's second scoring strike came 3:13 before halftime and helped Sacred Heart regain a 15-14 edge. Bundy now has five touchdown receptions this season and is averaging a team-high 17.2 yards per catch. The Selden, NY product ranks sixth in the league in receptions per game (3.40) and fourth in receiving yards per game (54.8).

NEC Football Defensive Player of the Week

Chad Wengert, Robert Morris

Jr, LB, 6-0, 240, Kempton, PA/Kutztown

Wengert tied a career-high with nine tackles in a 45-13 victory over Saint Francis (PA) on Saturday, including three solo stops. The junior linebacker also recorded two pass breakups at the line of scrimmage and one tack-for-loss. The Kempton, PA native helped seal the conference victory for Robert Morris by intercepting Red Flash quarterback Anthony Doria and rumbling 20 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter to give Robert Morris a commanding 31-13 advantage. On the season, Wengert ranks fifth on the Colonials defense in tackles (24) and earns his first career NEC Defensive Player of the Week award.

NEC Football Special Teams Player of the Week

Piotr Czech, Wagner

Jr., K/P, 6-5, 210, Keyport, NJ/Keyport

The four-time NEC Special Teams Player of the Week winner set a Northeast Conference and Wagner record by drilling a 54-yard field goal in a 25-17 loss to Sacred Heart on Saturday. The 54-yarder is the second longest in I-AA football this season. Czech topped the previous conference standard set by Wagner's Blake Abbot in 2001. The Keyport, NJ native was also perfect on his point-after-attempts (2-2). As a punter, Czech kicked six times for an average of 38.3 and twice placed Sacred Heart inside its own 20 yardline. On kickoffs, Czech collected two tackles.

NEC Football Rookie of the Week

Conte Cuttino, Stony Brook

Fr, RB, 5-9, 180, Uniondale, NY/Uniondale

Cuttino led the Seawolves ground attack as Stony Brook amassed 202 yards on the ground in its biggest offensive outburst of 2006 in a 36-17 triumph over previously unbeaten Monmouth. Cuttino concluded the game with a career-high 170 yards on 27 carries and a touchdown. In the second quarter, the freshman broke off a 52-yard run to set up a 22-yard field goal by kicker Matt Weeks. Before halftime, the Uniondale, NY product scored his first collegiate touchdown on a six-yard run with 7:30 remaining in the stanza to give SBU a 22-0 lead.

CCSU Returns To National Rankings; Albany Falls Out After Tough Loss

Central Connecticut State and Albany have now done a full circle on the Sports Network I-AA national poll. CCSU returns to the poll at No. 23 after drilling Saint Peter's on Saturday, 73-13. Albany is knocked out for falling to Ivy League foe Cornell, 23-21. However, either team has been able to put together two consecutive weeks in the poll. After earning No. 23 ranking on Sept. 18, the Blue Devils fell to rival Albany the following Saturday. For the win versus CCSU, Albany entered the poll for the first time, before the Cornell loss.

Five NEC Teams On TSN I-AA Mid Major Top-10 Poll; San Diego Holds At No. 1

Philadelphia, PA (Sports Network) - For the sixth time this season and 12th in a row overall, the San Diego Toreros claim the No. 1 spot in The Sports Network I-AA Mid-Major Top 10. The Toreros picked up 23 of a possible 24 first-place votes and 238 total points to stay at No. 1 after a 50-21 win at Davidson. San Diego puts its No. 1 ranking and 12-game winning streak on the line at home against Butler on Saturday.

Central Connecticut State bumped up three places to No. 2 after a 73-13 win against St. Peter's. Albany is down one position to No. 3 after losing, 23-21, at Cornell. Drake rose three slots to No. 4 after a 33-7 victory against Morehead State, while Monmouth slipped two positions to No. 5 after dropping a 36-17 home decision to Stony Brook. Dayton is at No. 6, with Robert Morris at No. 7, Duquesne at No. 8, Wagner at No. 9 and Jacksonville at No. 10. The Dolphins entered the rankings with a 34-17 win at Valparaiso, which also dropped the Crusaders out of the top 10.

Every team in the top 10 is in action this week, with one game between ranked opponents and eight teams taking on a conference foe. No. 7 Robert Morris is at No. 9 Wagner in a battle of ranked teams.

NEC Football Review: Stony Brook, CCSU, Sacred Heart, RMU Win; Albany Falls to Cornell

The 2006 NEC season is now completely underway as six teams squared off in league play, while Central Connecticut and Albany concluded their non-conference slate.

Monmouth (4-1, 0-1 NEC) opened the first four games this campaign unbeaten, while Stony Brook (1-4, 1-0 NEC) opened winless. Saturday afternoon, the Seawolves stopped the Hawks, 36-17, at West Long Branch. SBU stormed out to a 29-0 halftime lead and did not look back. Seawolf tailback Conte Cuttino rushed for 170 yards and a touchdown.

Like Monmouth, Wagner (4-1, 0-1 NEC) looked to open the season 5-0, but Sacred Heart (2-3, 1-0 NEC) got in the way, dropping the Seahawks, 25-17, at Fairfield. SHU quarterback Tyler Arciaga threw three touchdowns, including two to wideout Corey Bundy.

Robert Morris (3-2, 1-0 NEC) opened NEC play and won its third straight game after starting the season 0-2, knocking off Saint Francis (PA) (1-4, 0-1 NEC), 45-13, at Loretto. RMU signal caller Erik Cwalinski threw three touchdowns in the victory. Despite the loss, Saint Francis quarterback Anthony Doria became the NEC's all-time leading passer and wideouts Luke Palko and Michael Caputo broke the I-AA record for most receptions by a tandem.

Central Connecticut State (4-1, 0-1 NEC) had no trouble rebounding from its defeat to Albany last week, crushing Saint Peter's, 73-13, at Jersey City. CCSU running back Justise Hairston was superb, gaining 182 yards on just 17 carries and scoring three touchdowns. CCSU's 73 points scored marks a school record.

After entering the I-AA national poll scene for the first time in school history last week, No. 23 Albany (3-2, 1-0 NEC) fell, 23-21, to Ivy League foe Cornell at Ithaca, NY. Down 21-20 midway through the

fourth quarter, Cornell faked a punt on fourth-and-five and picked up a first down on a run by Michael Boyd. The Big Red continued the drive and converted the eventual game-winning field goal.

Doria Breaks Levcik's Passing Mark

Saint Francis (PA) senior quarterback Anthony Doria, who has attacked the Northeast Conference record books, became the league's all-time leader in career passing yards on Saturday. Doria threw for 156 yards in the loss to Robert Morris, passing former Colonial all-star Tim Levcik (1998-01) for the NEC all-time record. Doria now stands first with 7,390 yards through the air, surpassing Levcik's 7,222. Doria's 7,390 yards ranks fourth in amongst active I-AA passers.

Palko, Caputo Set I-AA Receiving Record

Red Flash senior wide receivers Michael Caputo and Luke Palko broke the NCAA Division I-AA record for "most career passes caught by two players on the same team." Caputo (203) had five catches and Palko (223) caught one on Saturday versus Robert to bring their combined career total 426, breaking a 20-year-old record formerly held by Texas Southern's Darrell Colbert and Donald Narcisse, who combined for 420 catches during their careers.

Wagner Kicker Piotr Czech Drills 54-Yarder

Wagner junior kicker Piotr Czech booted the longest field goal in Northeast Conference history on Saturday at Sacred Heart, walloping a 54-yarder as time expired in the first half of play. The previous conference record of 50 yards was also set by a Seahawk - Blake Abbot in 2001. Czech's 54-yarder is the second longest in I-AA football this season.

Quick Notes

- Central Connecticut State runner Justise Hairston ranks first in the I-AA in all-purpose yards per game (190.4) and sixth in rushing yards per game (131.8).
- Monmouth wide receiver Adam San Miguel, who leads the NEC with 39 catches, is second in I-AA in receptions per game this season (7.8).
- Saint Francis (PA) receiver Michael Caputo became with NEC's all-time career leader in receiving yards. Caputo (2,930) added 88 yards on Sept. 23 versus La Salle, passing Monmouth's Miles Austin (2,867).
- For the first time in league history, the NEC beat an Atlantic 10 opponent as Albany knocked off Delaware, 17-10, on September 16.
- Sacred Heart returner Evin Jones ranks second in I-AA in kickoff return average (34.25).
- The NEC finished the non-conference season with a 3-3 record versus Patriot League teams. Albany topped Lehigh on Sept. 2, while Monmouth beat Fordham on Sept. 2 and Colgate on Sept. 23.
- With 226 yards in a win over Saint Peter's on September 16, Monmouth's Brian Boland became the fourth quarterback in league history to throw for 6,000 career yards. Boland now stands in third with 6,472 yards behind RMU's Tim Levcik (7,222) and SFPAs Anthony Doria (7,390).
- Albany junior linebacker Colin Disch gained some revenge for the Disch family as the Great Danes beat national-power Delaware on September 16. Colin's brother, Ryan, started at linebacker for Colgate in the 2003 I-AA National Championship loss to Delaware.
- Saint Francis (PA) tailback Todd Harris now ranks fifth on the all-time career NEC rushing list with 2,663 yards after gaining 134 yards versus La Salle on Sept. 23. Harris stands behind Albany's Gary Jones (2002-03), who gained 3,033 yards.
- With 186, Wagner senior wide receiver Chris Turner broke the Wagner record for most career catches last Saturday, passing former teammate Shaun Grover (181), who set the mark last season. Turner ranks third on the NEC list for career receptions and yards (2,611).

NEC 2006 Football Television Package

The first game of the NEC television package aired on September 9 when Robert Morris fell to local rival Duquesne, 27-7, at Joe Walton Stadium in Moon Township, PA. On September 30, Western Pennsylvania counterparts Robert Morris and Saint Francis (PA) met in Loretto. RMU topped SFPA, 45-13.

The package wraps up with a Fox Sports-New York broadcast on October 28 as Monmouth hosts defending NEC champion Central Connecticut State at 12:00 pm. The game will also be televised in Connecticut and Rhode Island by Cox Cable.

- Albany dropped a 23-21 decision to Cornell on Sept. 30 as Peter Zell made a 33-yard field goal with 6:22 remaining. The winning drive was keyed by a faked punt on fourth-and-five at the Big Red 25-yard line ... The Great Danes, who have never beaten an Ivy League squad in three attempts, overcame a 13-point halftime deficit to take a 21-20 lead with 11:08 remaining ... DE **Mark Sheehan (Waterford, N.Y./Catholic Central)** scored on a 55-yard interception return to put his team ahead ... DE **Andre Coleman (Buffalo, N.Y./Burgard)** tipped an intended screen pass and Sheehan caught the ball and rumbled down the left sideline ... Sheehan became the fourth Albany defensive lineman to reach the end zone at the Division I-AA level and the first since Oct. 4, 2003 ... Albany entered the contest No. 23 in The Sports Network and College Sporting News (CSN) polls, the first time the program has been ranked nationally ... each team's rushing attack influenced the outcome ... The Great Danes gained just 111 net yards on the ground, while the UA defense allowed 237 rushing yards, the highest total by an opponent since Sept. 6, 2003 ... CB **Ryan Chrobak (Clinton, N.Y./Clinton Central)** had his streak of 37 consecutive starts snapped last week due to a sprained ankle ... CB **Rashad Barksdale (Hudson, N.Y./Hudson)** also was held out against Cornell (high ankle sprain) ... Barksdale is 16th nationally in punt returns with a 13.7 average ... CB **Jean Juste (Hempstead, N.Y./Uniondale)** and CB **E.B. McCloskey (Gloversville, N.Y./Gloversville)** put in solid efforts in their first career starts ... Juste made five tackles and McCloskey had three hits and one pass break-up ... Albany, Alabama A&M, Dayton and Lehigh are the only teams in Division I-AA to have all of their games decided by seven points or less ... The Great Danes' opening five games have been decided by an average of 3.4 points, the first time in the program's history that has happened ... Coleman and DT **Seamus McLaughlin (Wethersfield, Conn./Wethersfield)** posted career-highs with six and five tackles, respectively ... LB **Colin Disch (North Plainfield, N.J./North Plainfield)** became the fourth player in school history to reach the 300-career tackle mark (302) ... **Frank Blasinsky (North Royalton, Ohio / Parma Padua)** became the first true freshman to start at quarterback for the Great Danes since the 1994 season opener ... Blasinsky was replaced on the fourth offensive series by **Daniel Bocanegra (Daly City, Calif. / Jumpero Serra)** ... Bocanegra, who was expected to see limited action due to a bruised kidney from the previous week, completed 12-of-25 passes for 136 yards and one touchdown ... TE **Ross Jatkola (South Yarmouth, Mass. / Dennis-Yarmouth)** caught a career-long 38 pass that set up a third-quarter touchdown.

- The Blue Devils moved to 4-1 overall on the season with a record-breaking, 73-13 victory on the road vs. St. Peter's on Saturday afternoon. Central Connecticut scored a school-record 10 touchdowns and the 73 points is the most in the 68 seasons of CCSU football. The 60-point margin of victory for the Blue Devils is the second highest in school history (68-6 win over Glassboro State in 1972 and the largest margin of victory ever on the road for the Blue Devils ... CCSU ends a four-game road trip with a 3-1 record and outscored their opponents 138-66 in the four games ... The Blue Devils return home on October 7 to face Saint Francis (PA) in the first home game since September 2. The Blue Devils are 10-1 at home since the start of the 2004 season ... Against SPC, the Blue Devils rushed for 372 yards and held the Peacocks to 3 yards rushing on the ground on 17 carries. The defense forced five SPC turnovers ... Five Blue Devils - **Ryan Holmes (Union, NJ/Lackawanna JC)**, **Roberto Rodriguez (Miami, FL/Christopher Columbus)**, **Nick Colagiovanni (New Britain, CT/Milford Academy)**, **James Mallory (Buffalo, NY/Kenmore West)** and **Michael Bailey (Yonkers, NY/Gorton)** - scored their first career touchdowns ... Holmes completed 6-of-7 passes for 105 yards and a pair of scores and also rushed three times for 49 yards and a touchdown in his second career start ... The Blue Devils scored eight offensive touchdowns in the game (they also scored one on a blocked punt and one on a fumble return) ... CCSU's average offensive scoring drive was 4.8 plays, 49 yards and averaged just over 1:15 ... Senior running back **Justise Hairston (New Britain, CT/New Britain)** rushed 17 times for 182 yards and three touchdowns. Hairston scored on runs of one, 46 and 56 in the game and upped his season rushing total to 659 yards through the first five games including his third 100+ yard performance in the last four games.
