NEC Academic Honor Roll Scholar-Athletes

2008-09 NEC Women's Field Hockey Scholar-Athlete of the Year:

Blair Wynne, Lock Haven
Major: Master's of Liberal Arts

Lock Haven graduate student **Blair Wynne (Trinidad & Tobago/Sangre Grande)** took home NEC Scholar-Athlete honors in field hockey. Named NEC Player of the Year for the third consecutive season, the four-time first team all-NEC performer paced the conference with 20 goals and 48 points to lead the Lady Eagles to their third straight league title in 2008. Last season, Wynne was tabbed NEC Tournament Most Valuable Player for the second year in a row after recording three goals and two assists in postseason wins over Quinnipiac and Rider. The accolades were just beginning for the most decorated field hockey performer in NEC history, who for the second straight season was named a second team Longstreth/NHFCA All-American. The Trinidad & Tobago native was also selected to the womensfieldhockey.com Jack & Jill All-American second team. She wrapped up her brilliant career with 71 goals, 38 assists and 180 points. Wynne pursued a Master's of Liberal Arts degree and maintained a 3.73 grade point average.

With West Windsor, NJ providing the setting, this championship should be an exciting one with four hard-working, talented teams vying for the coveted berth into the NCAA Tournament.

Now in its 29th season, the NEC is proud to bring its field hockey championship to the Garden State and Rider University. Consisting of 12 institutions of higher learning located throughout six states, the NEC is committed to providing opportunities for student-athletes to achieve their fullest potential both in athletic competition and in the classroom, as well as becoming an NCAA Division I leader for athletic success, academic achievement and integrity, sportsmanship, equity and diversity, community partnership and national engagement. NEC institutions span a number of diverse locations, from the urban bustle of Brooklyn, NY to the rural settings of Loretto, PA and Emmitsburg, MD, to the beaches and shoreline of West Long Branch, NJ. But when it comes to intercollegiate athletics, the goal of the NEC is consistent - to provide its members the opportunity to participate in quality competition at the Division I level while operating programs that are fully integrated in the academic mission of each institution. The NEC's commitment to academic excellence has translated into national recognition for both individual student-athletes and the league's member institutions as a whole. NEC student-athletes consistently graduate at well above the national average and its athletic programs continue to be honored for their Graduation Success Rate (GSR) and Academic Progress Rate (APR) figures. On a conference-wide level, more than 2,000 student-athletes qualified for the NEC Academic Honor Roll in 2008-09, nearly a 25 percent increase from the previous year. Saint Francis (PA) posted the highest GPA in the conference to claim the NEC Institutional Academic Award for the first time.

On the field of play, the NEC has enjoyed many successes both regionally and nationally, competing in 21 NCAA championships each year. The future of the NEC looks even brighter with new facilities and improvements recently completed, under construction or in planning stages at a majority of the league's member institutions.

Message To Spectators

Northeast Conference member institutions value the principles of sportsmanship and the ideal of pursuing victory with honor in intercollegiate athletics. The Conference believes that athletics should be conducted in a way that reflects positively on the individual participants and institutions. 2008 Championship Game Recap:

Lock Haven Downs Rider, 3-0, for Third Consecutive Title

Lock Haven, PA - In a rematch of the 2007 championship match, top-seeded Lock Haven defeated No. 2 Rider, 3-0, on Nov. 8 at Charlotte E. Smith Field to capture the NEC's automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament. The Broncos (13-7, 6-1 NEC) have been the NEC runner-up three times since last winning the conference crown in 2004.

Lock Haven's **Casey Hughes (Schwenksville, PA/Souderton)** opened the scoring, ripping a shot past Rider goalie **Lyndsie Johnson (Gibbsboro, NJ/Eastern)** on a penalty corner, one of the Haven's nine on the day, in the 11th minute. Sophomore back **Alanna Lewis (Trinidad & Tobago/Southeast Port-of-Spain)** and junior back **Emma Wessner (Kutztown, PA/Kutztown)** earned assists on the play.

Lock Haven sophomore **Amy Hordendorf (Topton, PA/Brandywine Heights)** added her league-leading 21st goal of the season 14 minutes later to double the Lady Eagles' lead at 2-0 heading into the break.

LHU senior **Blair Wynne (Arima, Trinidad & Tobago/Sangre Grande)**, three-time NEC Player of the Year, chipped one into the upper left corner of the cage in the 61st minute for the Haven's final score. Wynne's third goal of the tournament solidified her selection as the Tournament's Most Valuable Player.

Johnson, who posted five shutouts in NEC regular season play and another in the Broncos' semifinal win, and freshman forward **Virginia Egusquiza (Gexto, Spain/Extracto del Expediente)** joined Ecke on the all-tournament squad. Egusquiza, who scored on a penalty corner against Sacred Heart, took three of Rider's five shots against Lock Haven.

Lock Haven traveled to the Patriot League field hockey tournament champion, American University, for the NCAA Play-In game and lost a 2-0 decision.
