Player of the Week

Naomi Campano Radio, Mount St. Mary's
GS, GK, Schnecksville, PA/Allentown Central Catholic

Campano Radio posted 17 saves with a 3.59 goals-against average and a .709 save percentage in a pair of wins for the Mount. In a 13-3 victory against Quinnipiac, the graduate student recorded 11 saves and held the Bobcats off the scoreboard in the second half, handing Quinnipiac its first conference loss of the season. Campano Radio then recorded six saves to reach the 700-stops plateau in an 11-4 win against Central Connecticut State. The 2004 Northeast Conference Player of the Year has anchored a Mount defense that has not allowed more than five goals in a game for six straight games and eight times overall this season. The scoreless second half against Quinnipiac marked the third time this season the squad has shutout an opponent in the final frame.



Rookie of the Week

Megan Nutter, Monmouth
Fr., Att., Moorestown, NJ/Moorestown

Nutter continued her outstanding rookie campaign with four goals and three assists in Monmouth's 2-0 week to earn her fourth NEC Rookie of the Week honor of the season. The freshman logged three goals and two assists in Monmouth's 16-3 win over St. Francis (PA) for her highest point output of the season. She then added a goal and an assist and collected four ground balls in the Hawks' 20-1 win over Robert Morris. Nutter has tallied 19 goals and dished out three assists on the season.

Team Updates

Central Connecticut State (2-9, 0-5 NEC)

Central Connecticut State posted a 1-2 week, opening with a 17-6 win over visiting Iona and then dropping a non-conference road match at Manhattan, 14-3, and a home conference game to league leading Mount St. Mary's, 11-4, on Sunday afternoon...**Abbey Capobianco (Framingham, MA/Framingham)** recorded a career-high six goals to lead the Blue Devils to victory over Iona...The rookie also recorded a pair of goals in both of CCSU's losses on the week...Keeper **Amanda Zabel (Wildwood, MO/Lafayette)** had a strong performance in goal against the Mount, holding them scoreless in the final 24 minutes of the game and recording a total of 25 saves while facing 38 shots...For the season, Capobianco leads the team in scoring with 28 goals and an assist while **Abby Hayes (Gales Ferry, CT/Ledyard)** is the team's second leading scorer with 14 goals and an assist...The Blue Devils host Le Moyne on Tuesday before heading to PA for the weekend to take on St. Francis (PA) on Saturday and Robert Morris on Sunday.

Long Island (4-6, 3-2 NEC)

Long Island went 2-1 in NEC play last week...The Blackbirds fell to Quinnipiac, 13-7, on Tuesday before bouncing back and recording a pair of weekend victories over Robert Morris, 19-2, and St. Francis (PA), 13-8...Sophomore **Amy Rizzo (Jackson, NJ/Jackson Memorial)** recorded eight points for the third time this season to match her own school record for LIU in a rout of Robert Morris on the Parade Grounds in Brooklyn, NY...LIU equaled its school record for most goals set April 23, 2004 in a 19-7 victory over St. Francis (PA)...The Blackbirds had 10 different players score a goal and 11 tally a point in the victory...Sophomore **Kayleigh Graves (Orlando, FL/Winter Springs)** scored four goals while Rizzo tallied six points (3 g, 3 a) against St. Francis (PA) at Robert Bliz Field at the C.W. Post campus in Brookville, NY...Senior **Patricia Parker (Long Branch, NJ/Brookdale)** was brilliant in goal, registering double digit saves (11) for the sixth time this season...The Blackbirds host Monmouth on Friday in their only contest of the week.

Monmouth (8-3, 4-0 NEC)

Monmouth went 2-0 in NEC action last week, defeating St. Francis (PA), 16-3, on Friday and Robert Morris, 20-1, on Sunday...The Hawks' 19-point margin of victory vs. Robert Morris was one shy of the school record set in a 20-0 win over St. Francis (PA) on April 5, 2002...**Jeanette Stott (Upper Darby, PA/Upper Darby)** led the way with four goals and eight assists over the two game span, moving into a tie for fifth place on Monmouth's career scoring list with 117 points...The junior currently ranks ninth in career goals (78), sixth in career assists (39) and seventh in assists in a season, with 21 assists so far this year...**Megan Nutter (Moorestown, NJ/Moorestown)** logged three goals and two assists against St. Francis (PA), posting her highest point output of the season, and added a goal and an assist in the Hawks' victory over Robert Morris...Sophomore **Katie Degen (Glen Head, NY/North Shore)** recorded a pair of assists against RMU to move into eighth place on Monmouth's career assist list with 27...Monmouth looks to build upon its seven game winning streak and tie the school record for consecutive wins (8) set in 2000, when it hosts Villanova tomorrow...The Hawks then take on Long Island on Friday and Sacred Heart on Sunday in a pair of conference matchups.

Mount St. Mary's (8-4, 5-0 NEC)

Mount St. Mary's extended its winning streak to six games, defeating Quinnipiac, 13-3, on Friday and Central Connecticut State, 11-4, on Sunday...The Mount has held their opponent to under five goals for the past six games and eight times this season...In their win over Quinnipiac, the Mountaineers held the Bobcats scoreless in the second half, marking the third time this season they have accomplished the feat...**Erin LaMotte (Hampstead, MD/North Carroll)** posted a season-high four goals and an assist against Quinnipiac and then added her second hat trick of the week along with an assist against the Blue Devils...The senior ranks fourth in Mount history in both career ground balls (163) and career goals (88)...Sophomore **Casey Paris (Longwood, FL/Lake Brantley)** added five goals and three assists for the Mount, while senior **Nicole DiAngelo (Annapolis, MD/St. Mary's)** posted three goals and two assists last week...Sophomore **Jenna Duffy (Bel Air, MD/Catholic)** notched two goals and two assists against Quinnipiac and sophomore **Katie Mason (Ellicott City, MD/Mount Hebron)** recorded three tallies in the two contests...Junior **Kirby Day (Forest Hills, MD/North Harford)** cracked the Top-10 on the program's all-time goals list with 64 after recording two markers on Sunday...Graduate student **Naomi Campano Radio (Schnecksville, PA/Allentown Central Catholic)** made 17 saves over the two game span, becoming the first player in program history to record 700 saves for her career...The Mount wraps up its non-conference schedule on Thursday against Howard before traveling to Wagner on Saturday.

Quinnipiac (5-6, 4-1 NEC)

Quinnipiac went 2-1 in conference play last week, defeating Long Island, 13-7, and Wagner, 16-9, but falling to Mount St. Mary's, 13-3...Senior **Christy Smallman (Boxford, MA/Masconomet)** tallied 5 goals and 6 assists on the week, including a 3 goal, 4 assist effort against Wagner, while junior **Danielle Mormile (Oceanside, NY/Oceanside)** registered 7 goals and an assist for the Bobcats...Goalie **Ashley Thompson (Hunt Valley, MD/Roland Park)** posted 18 saves against Wagner, tying a season-high...Junior **Melissa Jordan (Williston Park, NY/Herricks)** caused 10 turnovers and scooped up 12 ground balls on the week, while Smallman added 10 ground balls for the Bobcats over the three game span...After three straight at home, Quinnipiac hits the road for four in a row beginning on Tuesday at Binghamton...The Bobcats play league games at Robert Morris and St. Francis (PA) this weekend.

Robert Morris (0-10, 0-5 NEC)

Robert Morris suffered three NEC losses last week, falling to St. Francis (PA), 11-6, Long Island, 19-2, and Monmouth, 20-1...Freshman **Bethany Mahaffey (Edgewater, MD/Annapolis Area Christian)** has recorded a point in the last six games, totalling a goal and six assists during the streak...The Colonials wrap up their 2005 home schedule this weekend with three games in three days, hosting Quinnipiac on Friday, UC Davis on Saturday and Central Connecticut State on Sunday.

Sacred Heart (7-5, 2-3 NEC)

The Pioneers split their two games last week, beating Siena, 8-5, but losing an important NEC match to Wagner, 13-11...Sacred Heart used a big first half effort to beat the Saints, going up 4-0 and leading 7-4 at the break en route to an 8-5 win...The Pioneers got two goals and a season high three assists from senior **JoAnn Montesarchio (Cortlandt Manor, NY/Walter Panas)**, while senior goalkeeper **Maggie Brauer (Blauvelt, NY/Tappan Zee)** turned in a season-high 13 saves, including nine in the second half, to preserve the victory over Siena...In their loss to Wagner, the Seahawks ran out to a 7-0 advantage in the early going and led 8-1 at the half, outshooting Sacred Heart 17-8 in the half and forcing 13 Pioneer turnovers...Sacred Heart responded in the second half, outshooting the Seahawks 24-8 in the period and forcing 11 turnovers...Wagner, however, made all eight shots count, scoring five times in the half to thwart the Pioneer rally...Sacred Heart travels to Marist on Wednesday and Monmouth on Sunday.

St. Francis (PA) (1-6, 1-4 NEC)

St. Francis (PA) went 1-2 last week, recording their first victory of the season with a 11-6 win over visiting Robert Morris on Wednesday...The Red Flash then fell to Monmouth, 16-3, and Long Island, 13-8, to round out the week...Senior **Katy Green (Bethel Park, PA/Bethel Park)** tallied 9 goals and 3 assists on the week, including a five goal, 2 assist performance against Robert Morris...The Red Flash have three home games this week, hosting Binghamton on Thursday, Central Connecticut State on Saturday and Quinnipiac on Sunday.

Wagner (5-8, 3-2 NEC)

Wagner went 1-2 last week, defeating Sacred Heart on the road, 13-11, but falling to Stony Brook, 15-14, and Quinnipiac, 16-9...Senior **Leann Matta (Bel Air, MD/Bel Air)** and junior **Heather George (W. Allenhurst, NJ/Ocean Twp.)** each notched four goals against Stony Brook, while sophomore **Jessica Ellis (Fairport, NY/Fairport)** tallied a hat trick and Matta added two assists...In the Seahawks' win over Sacred Heart, George tallied a season-high six goals to lead the attack, while Matta and junior **Darby Biggart (Crowsville, MD/Archbishop Spalding)** each notched two goals...Matta tallied five goals against Quinnipiac but the Seahawks could not mount a comeback after starting the game down 7-1...Senior goalkeeper **Erica Brown (Havertown, PA/Haverford Twp.)** made 24 saves for the Seahawks over the three game span...Wagner hosts Mount St. Mary's at 4:00 pm on Saturday in its only game of the week.
