Player of the Week

Katie Degen, Monmouth
 So., M, Glen Head, NY/North Shore

Degen had an outstanding week on both sides of the ball, helping the Hawks to a 3-0 week. Degen tallied ten goals and four assists on the offensive end and 11 ground balls and 11 caused turnovers on the defensive end. The sophomore also had eight draw controls on the week. In Monmouth's 19-5 win over Lafayette, Degen scored three goals and added an assist, while logging three ground balls, two draw controls and one caused turnover. In the Hawks' 19-9 victory over Wagner, Degen logged three goals and two assists, while adding eight ground balls, two draw controls and six caused turnovers. She finished the week with four goals, one assist, four draw controls and four caused turnovers in Monmouth's 17-6 defeat of Central Connecticut State. Degen ranks fifth in the NEC in points per game (3.11), second in ground balls per game (3.44) and is tied for the conference lead in caused turnovers per game (2.33).



Rookie of the Week

Salamone earns her second Rookie of the Week honor of the season after scoring seven goals for Sacred Heart in a 2-1 week for the Pioneers. Salamone scored a season-high five goals in Sacred Heart's 14-13 win over Lehigh. The rookie came back with a goal in the Pioneers' 12-8 win over Long Island and then added a goal and an assist in their loss at Mount St. Mary's. Salamone ranks third on the team in scoring with 14 goals and four assists on the season.

NEC Women's Lacrosse Notes (through games of 4/3/05):

Team Updates

Central Connecticut State (1-7, 0-4 NEC)

The Central Connecticut State dropped three straight games last week, losing by an 11-8 margin to both Long Island and Quinnipiac, and then falling to Monmouth, 17-6, to end the week on Sunday. In the Blue Devils' loss to Long Island, freshman **Abbey Capobianco (Framingham, MA/Framingham)** and sophomore **Abby Hayes (Gales Ferry, CT/Ledyard)** each finished the game with three goals, while Hayes added an assist to her efforts. Against Quinnipiac, Capobianco, **Danielle Adams (Mineola, NY/Mineola)** and **Amy Clark (Southington, CT/Southington)** each tallied a pair of scores with Adams adding an assist. In yesterday's match-up with Monmouth, Hayes led the team with a trio of goals, while Adams scored twice. For the season, Capobianco continues to lead the team in scoring with 18 goals with Hayes quickly approaching with 10 goals and an assist. The Blue Devils host Iona tomorrow, before making the trip to Riverdale, NY for a meeting with Manhattan on Thursday and returning home to take on CCSU on Sunday.

Long Island (2-5, 1-1 NEC)

The Blackbirds went 1-1 in games this week. In an 11-8 triumph at Central Connecticut State, sophomore **Amy Rizzo (Jackson, NJ/Jackson Memorial)** broke her own school record with seven goals and tied her own mark with eight points. Rizzo entered the week tied for 16th in the nation in scoring, averaging 3.0 goals per contest. Junior **Chrissie Carleton (Jackson, NJ/Jackson Memorial)** also scored and added an assist for the Blackbirds, who gained a 25-24 shots advantage. Senior **Patricia Parker (Long Branch, NJ/Brookdale)** made 12 saves for her second victory of the year. In the second contest, a 12-8 setback against Sacred Heart, sophomore **Kayleigh Graves (Orlando, FL/Winter Springs)** scored three goals and added an assist. Freshman **Xiomara Garcia (Pottstown, PA/Pottstown)** made an impact on defense, causing four turnovers in the Blackbirds fifth loss of the season. Long Island's lone game this week is at Quinnipiac on Tuesday.

Monmouth (6-3, 2-0 NEC)

Monmouth won all three of their contests last week, defeating Lafayette, 19-5, Wagner, 19-9, and Central Connecticut State, 17-6. Sophomore **Katie Degen (Glen Head, NY/North Shore)** tallied 14 points on 10 goals and four assists and registered 11 ground balls and 11 caused turnovers in the Hawks' three victories. With ten goals on the week, **Jeanette Stott (Upper Darby, PA/Upper Darby)** moved into the top 10 on MU's career goals list. Stott is tied for ninth place with 74 career goals. Stott's eight points against CCSU (3g, 5a) put her over the 100-point plateau for her career. She now has 105 points for her career, ranking seventh on Monmouth's career scoring list, and needs nine more points to pass *Survivor* Steph LaGrossa for sixth place. The junior's five assists in the contest were also one shy of the Hawks' school record. With 75 points for her career, including 32 through nine games this season, sophomore **Carolyn Ravelia (Fairfax, VA/WT. Woodson)** is on pace to become just the second Monmouth player to tally 100 or more points in her first two seasons. Monmouth's five-game win streak is the best since the Hawks won five in a row midway through the 2001 season. The Hawks look to continue this streak as they host St. Francis (PA) and Robert Morris this weekend.

Mount St. Mary's (6-4, 3-0 NEC)

Mount St. Mary's went 3-0 last week, defeating St. Francis (PA), 19-2, Manhattan, 16-4, in a rematch of last year's NCAA play-in game and Sacred Heart, 12-4, in a rematch of the 2004 NEC semifinals. **Nicole Di'Angelo (Annapolis, MD/St. Mary's)** paced the squad in the three games with six goals and seven assists for 13 points. The senior tallied two goals and five assists against the Jaspers, tying the program record for assists in a game. Di'Angelo moved into fourth place on the program's all-time career assists list with 49 and jumped into fifth place on the program's all-time career points list with 126. Senior **Erin LaMotte (Hampstead, MD/North Carroll)** added five goals and six assists on the week and moved into fifth place on the program's all-time goals list with 84 and sixth on the all-time ground balls list with 157. Sophomore **Katie Mason (Ellicott City, MD/Mount Hebron)** added six goals and three helpers in the three games, including a career-best four markers along with two assists in the win against the Pioneers. Sophomore **Jenna Duffy (Bel Air, MD/Catholic)** posted four goals and five assists for nine points in the week, including two goals and three assists for a career-high five points against Manhattan. Sophomore **Casey Paris (Longwood, FL/Lake Brantley)** found the twine seven times and junior **Ellie Keener (Lancaster, PA/Lampeter-Strasburg)** added four goals and two assists, both registering hat tricks against Manhattan. Red shirt junior **Kelly Nangle (Glen Burnie, MD/Glen Burnie)** recorded her first collegiate goal against St. Francis (PA) and moved into second place on the program's all-time career caused turnovers list with 83. The Mount defense has held their opponent to under five goals for four straight games and six times overall this season. Mount St. Mary's returns to action on Friday at Quinnipiac and travels to Central Connecticut State on Sunday.

Quinnipiac (3-5, 2-0 NEC)

After dropping their first five contests of the year, the Bobcats have now won three in a row. Quinnipiac defeated Columbia, 11-8, on Tuesday and knocked off conference foe Central Connecticut State by the same score on Friday night to improve to 2-0 in NEC play. Senior **Christy Smallman (Boxford, MA/Masconomet)** scored three goals and dished out two assists against Columbia and registered one goal and four assists in the Bobcats' win over CCSU, while senior **Amy Willis (Hingham, MA/Hingham)** tallied six points (5g, 1a) in their two wins last week. The Bobcats return to action on Tuesday for an NEC game against Long Island before hosting Mount St. Mary's and Wagner over the weekend.

Robert Morris (0-7, 0-2 NEC)

Robert Morris fell to St. Bonaventure, 16-2, in its only contest last week. Freshman **Bethany Mahaffey (Edgewater, MD/Annapolis Area Christian)** has recorded a point in the last four games, tallying a goal and four assists during the streak, while freshman **Josephine Zizie (Chicago, IL/Culver Girls Academy)** has a four-game goal scoring streak intact and has six total points over the last four games (5g, 1a). The Colonials' NEC contest with St. Francis (PA) originally scheduled for March 29 has been rescheduled for Tuesday, April 5. Robert Morris then travels to Long Island and Monmouth for a pair of weekend matchups.

Sacred Heart (6-4, 2-2 NEC)

Sacred Heart turned in a 2-1 week with a pair of home wins and a 12-4 loss at NEC leader Mount St. Mary's on Sunday. The Pioneers scored 11 first half goals and withstood a late Lehigh rally to come away with a 14-13 win over the Mountain Hawks on Tuesday afternoon. Freshman **Katie Salamone (Baltimore, MD/Towson)** scored a season-high five goals to lead the Pioneers to their fifth win on the season. Sophomore **Heather Gureckis (Nashua, NH/Nashua)** scored three goals, seniors **JoAnn Montesarchio (Cortlandt Manor, NY/Walter Panas)** and **Natalie Smith (Wantagh, NY/Wantagh)** finished with two markers and two assists each and senior **Maggie Brauer (Blauvelt, NY/Tappan Zee)** made eight saves to earn the win. Gureckis scored four goals as the Pioneers battled back from a 6-3 deficit with six straight goals to come away with a 12-8 Northeast Conference victory over visiting Long Island on Friday afternoon. The sophomore then scored twice and Salamone tallied a goal and an assist in the Pioneers' loss to the Mount. Sacred Heart is back in action tomorrow at Siena before hosting Wagner on Friday.

St. Francis (PA) (0-4, 0-2 NEC)

St. Francis (PA) fell to Mount St. Mary's, 19-2, in its only contest last week. The Red Flash are back in action tomorrow (4/5), taking on Robert Morris at home, before traveling to Monmouth and Long Island this weekend.

Wagner (4-6, 2-1 NEC)

Wagner lost both of its games last week to fall to 4-6 overall and 2-1 in the NEC. The Seahawks dropped an 18-11 decision at Drexel on Tuesday before falling 19-9 to Monmouth on Friday. In the loss at Drexel, sophomore **Jessica Ellis (Fairport, NY/Fairport)** tallied five goals, junior **Darby Biggart (Crowsville, MD/Archbishop Spalding)** scored four times and senior goalkeeper **Erica Brown (Havertown, PA/Haverford Twp.)** made 13 saves in net. In the loss to Monmouth, the Seahawks trailed just 3-2 after the first ten minutes of action before Monmouth scored nine unanswered goals to take a 12-2 advantage before the teams went into halftime with MU leading 12-4. Wagner received two goals from senior **Leann Matta (Bel Air, MD/Bel Air)**, **Burgess, George** and **Ellis**, while Brown registered 12 saves for the Green & White. This week, Wagner hosts Stony Brook on Tuesday before traveling to Connecticut to face Sacred Heart on Friday and Quinnipiac on Sunday.
