#### adidas/NEC Player of the Week

**Daniel Moir, Saint Francis (PA)**

Sr., F, Christchurch, New Zealand

Moir notched his team-leading fourth goal and provided the first assist of his senior campaign to help the Red Flash post a 2-0 victory over #7 Monmouth on Sunday afternoon. While the Hawks had not allowed more than one goal in any game this season and had not surrendered a tally in eight contests, Moir struck early to give SFPA a 1-0 lead at the 10:26 mark. The goal was Moir's first game-winner in two years. The New Zealand native helped put the match out of reach in the 82nd minute when he headed a cross to teammate Kingsley McLeod for score and a 2-0 lead. Moir's contributions helped SFPA hand the Hawks their first loss in 14 matches. Currently, Moir paces the team with nine points on four goals (tied for eighth in NEC) and one assist.

#### adidas/NEC Rookie of the Week

**Dominic Reinold, Fairleigh Dickinson**

Fr., MF, Wesseling, Germany

Reinold logged five points to lift the Knights to a 3-0 victory over the visiting Bryant Bulldogs (Oct. 25) in FDU's lone contest of the week. The midfielder had a hand in every goal as he registered the first two tallies and assisted on the third. Reinold deposited the eventual game-winner in the 22nd minute to give FDU a 1-0 lead before the rookie tacked on an insurance marker at the 84:29 mark. Less than three minutes later, Reinold was at it again, this time providing the assist on teammate Leslie Ayafor's goal, solidifying the victory and improving the Knights' record to 6-8-1 overall and 3-3-1 in NEC play. Reinold, who kicked off the 2009 season as the adidas/NEC Rookie of the Week, currently leads the NEC with 20 points and eight goals, while his four assists are tied for fourth on the loop.

## NEC Men's Soccer Notes *(through games of October 25)*

### Around The League:

**Monmouth** moved up one spot to #7 in this week's NSCAA National Rankings, the organization released on Tuesday, marking the highest national ranking for any program in MU history. The No. 7 ranking matches the national standing Fairleigh Dickinson attained during the 2005 season, as the mark is a Northeast Conference best in the modern era. MU (13-1-1, 5-1-1 NEC), #1 Akron (15-0-0) and UC Santa Barbara (11-3-1), are the only clubs in the Top-25 with double-digits wins each so far this season...MU is also ranked atop the NSCAA North Atlantic Regional Rankings, where they have been all season...The Hawks also come in this week ranked 8th by *Top Drawer Soccer*, 9th by *College Soccer News* and #10 by *Soccer America*...MU has outscored its opposition by a 24-5 margin this year and have more than a 2-1 advantage on corner kicks (105-46)...**Quinnipiac** moved up in the NSCAA North Atlantic Region poll as the Bobcats now share the second slot with MAAC opponent Iona. **St. Francis (NY)** followed suit, jumping from ninth to fifth place, while **Sacred Heart** rounds out the NEC representatives at number nine...Central Connecticut State junior midfielder **Robert Cavener (Tynemouth, England)** recorded his team and league-leading eighth assist against SFNY on Oct. 23 to become the first Blue Devil to log eight assists since Yan Klukowski during CCSU's NCAA Tournament run in 2007...The Blue Devils have now competed in five double overtime games this year, coming away with a record of 1-3-1 in those contests...**Long Island** has also found itself in five overtime situations and have been able to snap the tie in each contest, earning a 4-1 mark...QU finished its 2009 regular season home slate undefeated (4-0-5) and has not lost in Hamden in its last 13 contests dating back to last season (7-0-6)...QU junior defender **Tolle Staffanson (Goteborg, Sweden)** became the seventh different Bobcat to score his first career goal this season when he found the back of the net in the 18th minute of play against St. Francis (NY) on Oct. 25...Robert Morris freshman goalkeeper **Toba Bolaji (Vaughn, Ontario)** recorded a season-best and career-high 11 saves - four of which came in overtime - to help the Colonials preserve a scoreless draw with Mount St. Mary's (Oct. 25). The 11 stops represent the sixth-most saves in a game at RMU, while it was Bolaji's fourth shutout in his past eight starts...SFNY juniors **Nick Baum (Staten Island, NY/St. Joseph by the Sea)** and **Greg Baum (Staten Island, NY/St. Joseph by the Sea)** have each recorded a game-winning goal in back-to-back contests, as Nick Baum tallied the lone goal in a 1-0 win over Robert Morris (Oct. 18) and Greg Baum lifted the Terriers over CCSU, 3-2, in overtime on Oct. 23...A 2-0 Saint Francis (PA) victory over #7 Monmouth on Sunday snapped MU's five-game winning streak, as well as its school-record 14-match unbeaten streak to begin the season...The defeat also broke the Hawks' eight-match shutout run...With the final two weekends of the 2009 regular season approaching, QU senior goalkeeper **Freddy Hall (St. George, Bermuda)** leads the NEC with a .931 save percentage, while his eight shutouts rank second in the league...Having allowed just four goals this season, MU's **Bryan Meredith (Scotch Plains, NJ/Scotch Plains-Fanwood)** sits atop the NEC with a 0.28 goals against average and 11 shutouts...Saint Francis' (PA) **Darius Motazed (North Vancouver, Canada)** has collected a league-high 103 saves (6.44 spg) during his junior campaign...Offensively, Fairleigh Dickinson freshman **Dominic Reinold (Wesseling, Germany)** took over first place in points (20) and goals (eight), while CCSU's Cavener's eight assists ranks first on the loop...The Hawks' **Ryan Kinne (Naugatuck, CT/Naugatuck)** and teammate **Ryan Clark (Freehold, NJ/Freehold Township)** still pace the NEC with four game-winners apiece...Monmouth and Central Connecticut State still pace the Conference offensively, as the Hawks have accumulated 67 points and 24 goals this season, while the Blue Devils have averaged 16.50 shots per game...MU, CCSU and FDU share the top spot in the assists column with 19 each...Representing the NEC on the national landscape offensively is MU as the Hawks' 1.77 goals per game ranked 33rd in last week's NCAA National Statistics Summary, which included games played through Oct. 18...MU sat in the second slot in three defensive categories, including team goals against average (0.23), shutout percentage (0.96) and team save percentage (.919)...Quinnipiac also ranks among each of those categories, taking fifth with a 0.43 team GAA, 25th with a 0.73 shutout percentage and first with a .935 save percentage...Joining them is Sacred Heart with a 0.64 GAA (15th) and .901 save percentage (fifth)...Individuals representing the NEC in the NCAA is CCSU's Cavener, who ranked 11th with 0.58 assists per game, while MU's Kinne landed 37th with 1.38 points per game and 50th with 0.54 goals per game...The Hawks' Meredith claimed second with a 0.23 goals against average and fourth with a .919 save percentage...QU's Hall and SHU's **Alex Fait (Ottawa, Canada)** ranked sixth (0.43) and 17th (0.64) in goals against average, respectively, while the duo also took first (.934) and sixth (.900) in save percentage...The 2009 season culminates at the NEC Men's Soccer Tournament, which will take place at the home of the high seed on November 13 & 15. MU is the four-time defending regular season champion, while FDU is the defending tournament champion...Monmouth was the preseason favorite to capture the 2009 NEC championship, according to a poll of the league head coaches. The Hawks received five first-place votes and were followed by Fairleigh Dickinson. A trio of first-place nods placed the Knights ahead of Quinnipiac, which also garnered a top vote, while St. Francis (NY) claimed the fourth slot and the remaining two first-place nods. Rounding out the top-five was Mount St. Mary's, while Central Connecticut State and Sacred Heart sat in sixth and seventh, respectively. Long Island and Saint Francis (PA) shared eighth-place. Robert Morris and Bryant rounded out the poll.

### Team By Team Notes:

#### **Bryant (4-12, 2-6 NEC)**

The Bulldogs upset Sacred Heart on Friday with a late first-half tally complements of junior forward **Tom Nelan's (East Haddam, CT/Nathan Hale-Ray)** third goal of the season...The play began with a free kick service from midfielder **Sean Reilly (Monroe, NY/Monroe-Woodbury)**, as he logged the second assist of his freshman campaign...The score stood to be the contest's lone goal and game-winner as freshman keeper **Matt Miscione (Ashburn, VA/Stone Bridge)** made seven saves to preserve the win and his third shutout of the year...Sunday's match with Fairleigh Dickinson resulted in a 3-0 loss to the Knights as the Bulldogs were outshot 16-6, including 7-2 in shots on target...Miscione came away with four stops...At 4-12 overall and 2-6 in NEC play, BU rounds out its 2009 regular season on a Western PA road swing on Friday, Oct. 30 and Sunday, Nov. 1 at Saint Francis (PA) and Robert Morris, respectively.

#### **Central Connecticut State (6-7-1, 1-5-1 NEC)**

Central Connecticut State extended its losing streak to five games with a pair of double overtime losses at home last weekend...The Blue Devils fell to St. Francis (NY) by a count of 3-2 on Friday before dropping a 1-0 decision at the hands of Long Island on Sunday...Against the Terriers, junior captain and league assist leader (eight) **Robert Cavener (Tynemouth, England)** scored a goal and added an assist to keep CCSU in the game...The tally was his first of the season, coming by means of a successful penalty kick that gave the Blue Devils a 2-1 lead in the 80th minute...Cavener assisted on the team's first goal of the contest, providing a cross to senior **Raphael Guimaraes (Marlborough, MA)** to tie the game at one at the 72:11 mark...The helper was the midfielder's team and league-leading eighth of the season, as no Blue Devil has recorded eight assists since Yan Klukowski during CCSU's NCAA Tournament run in 2007...The Terriers went on to defeat the Blue Devils with a goal with just eight seconds remaining in the second OT, while Sunday's result was not much different as LIU notched the go-ahead goal with just 47 seconds left in the second extra session...Senior netminder **Paul Armstrong (Liverpool, England)** made eight saves against SFNY and added four more stops against LIU...CCSU has now competed in five double overtime games this year, coming away with a record of 1-3-1 in those contests...The Blue Devils are now 6-7-1 overall and 1-5-1 in league play as they hit the road to take on #7 Monmouth (Oct. 30) at 3:00 pm and Mount St. Mary's (Nov. 1) at 1:00 pm.

#### **Fairleigh Dickinson (6-8-1, 3-3-1 NEC)**

The Knights' lone contest of the week resulted in a 3-0 victory over the visiting Bryant Bulldogs (Oct. 25)...Freshman **Dominic Reinold (Wesseling, Germany)** hand a hand in every goal, scoring twice and dishing out an assist...Reinold put FDU on the scoreboard in the 22nd minute when he tapped in a cross from sophomore **Cristian Vasconez (Quito, Ecuador)**, marking his fourth helper of the season...It wasn't until the 85th minute that Reinold would attack again, adding insurance with his team-leading eighth goal of the year...Providing the assist was freshman **Jeffrey Barrenechea (Lodi, NJ)**

**Paramus Catholic** for the first point of his collegiate career...Senior **Leslie Ayafor (Lauderhill, FL/Manchester Arts)** solidified the victory with the final tally of the game at the 87:17 mark when he collected a pass from Reinold...The win was the fifth for goalkeeper **Majdi Zaineh (Clifton, NJ/Clifton)** as he made two saves to earn his third shutout of the season...Following his five-point week, Reinold currently paces the NEC with 20 points and eight points, while the midfielder is tied for fourth in the league with four assists...FDU takes to the pitch again on Friday, Oct. 30 at Long Island.

#### **Long Island (6-9, 3-4 NEC)**

Long Island followed up a 1-0 loss to Quinnipiac (Oct. 23) with a 1-0 triumph in double overtime at Central Connecticut State (Oct. 25)...The Bobcats tallied an 85th-minute goal to get past the Blackbirds as **Adam Janssen (Toronto, Ontario)** made eight saves in the contest...With under one minute left in the second extra session against the Blue Devils, freshman **Jakeem Johnson (Upper Montclair, NJ/Montclair)** scored his team-leading seventh goal (tied for second in NEC) and third game-winning tally (third in NEC) of the season...The forward collected a deflection from an initial shot by **Josh Maley (Poughkeepsie, NY/Spackenkill)** and slipped it past CCSU's Paul Armstrong...Johnson is now tied with teammate **Steve Jakubowski (West Deptford, NJ/West Deptford)** for first place on the squad with 15 points...Janssen notched six saves for the win and the second clean sheet of his sophomore campaign...In five overtime games, the Blackbirds are 4-1 and have avoided a tie in each contest...LIU welcomes Fairleigh Dickinson (Oct. 30) and Sacred Heart (Nov. 1) for its final home tilts on LIU Field this season.

#### **#7 Monmouth (13-1-1, 5-1-1 NEC • Ranked 7th in NSCAA National Poll; 1st in North Atlantic Region)**

The Hawks' trip to Western PA resulted in a 1-0 win over Robert Morris (Oct. 23) and their first loss of 2009, falling 2-0 to Saint Francis (PA) on Sunday...Junior defender **Anthony Vasquez (Belford, NJ/Middletown North)** scored his first career goal against the Colonials, while classmate **Ryan Kinne (Naugatuck, CT/Naugatuck)** assisted on the tally, to mark his team-leading fifth helper...Junior goalie **Bryan Meredith (Scotch Plains, NJ/Scotch Plains-Fanwood)** logged his league-leading 11th shutout of the season, which was also the 22nd of his career in West Long Branch...SFPA's tally at the 10:26 mark was the first goal allowed by the Hawks in the last 789:41 of game action...In the 12th minute, Meredith received a red card and freshman counterpart **Alex Blackburn (Natick, MA/Natick)** took over in net for the duration of the contest, making three saves...The loss snapped MU's five-game winning streak, as well as its school-record 14-match unbeaten streak to begin the season...The defeat also broke the Hawks' eight-match shutout run...With three contests remaining in the 2009 regular season, MU remains on the Great Lawn to host Central Connecticut State (Oct. 30) at 3:00 pm, Quinnipiac (Nov. 1) at 1:00 pm and Mount St. Mary's (Nov. 6) at 3:00 pm.

#### **Mount St. Mary's (4-9-1, 3-3-1 NEC)**

The Mount jumped into a three-way tie for fourth place in the NEC standings after defeating Saint Francis (PA), 1-0, on Friday and ending the week in a double-overtime scoreless draw with Robert Morris on Sunday...Against the Red Flash, sophomore forward **Chris Wheeler (Newcastle, Australia)** scored his fifth goal of the season in the 78th minute off an assist from defender **Steve Pathroff (North Ridgeville, OH/St. Ignatius)**...Wheeler leads the team with 11 points (10th in NEC) and five goals (tied for sixth in NEC)...Junior keeper **Chris Davis (Townsville, Australia)** made two saves against SFPA, while freshman counterpart **Kyle McGehrin (Upper Marlboro, MD/Archbishop Spalding)** made his collegiate debut against the Colonials, notching five saves over 110 minutes of action...The Mountaineers return to action on Oct. 30 at home against Quinnipiac at 7:00 pm before hosting Central Connecticut State on Nov. 1 at 1:00 pm.

#### **Quinnipiac (8-1-6, 5-0-2 NEC • Ranked T-2nd in NSCAA North Atlantic Region)**

Quinnipiac took sole possession of first place in the NEC standings with 17 total points and an unbeaten league mark at 5-0-2 following a win and a tie last weekend...The Bobcats remain the lone undefeated team in the NEC...Against Long Island (Oct. 23), sophomore forward **Durval Pereira (Cheshire, CT/Cheshire)** registered a late goal to lift QU to a 1-0 victory...In the 85th minute, Pereira received a pass from senior co-captain **Shane Recklet (Shelton, CT/Shelton)** and lined a shot from 15-yards out, which benefited from a deflection off of a Blackbird defender, sending the ball into the top left corner...The goal was Pereira's first of the season, while Recklet's assist marked his first point of 2009...Against St. Francis (NY) (Oct. 25), junior defender **Tolle Staffanson (Goteborg, Sweden)** became the seventh different Bobcat to score his first career goal this season when he found the back of the net in the 18th minute of play...Freshman **Philip Suprise (Milwaukee, WI/Pius XI)** corralled a loose ball in the box and flicked a pass to his right where an unmarked Staffanson was waiting to head the ball past SFNY's Chris Antonino...The Terriers tied the game with five minutes left in regulation as both teams battled through two scoreless extra sessions, recording a 1-1 draw...QU fired 11 shots on goal to SFNY's eight, while senior netminder **Freddy Hall (St. George, Bermuda)** made seven saves...After finishing the 2009 regular season undefeated at home (4-0-5), the Bobcats round out their schedule with a trio of road games at Mount St. Mary's (Oct. 30), Monmouth (Nov. 1) and Central Connecticut State (Nov. 6).

#### **Robert Morris (2-12-3, 2-3-3 NEC)**

Robert Morris came away with a loss and a tie in its final full weekend of regular season play in 2009...Seventh-ranked Monmouth handed RMU a 1-0 loss on Friday before the Colonials battled Mount St. Mary's through 110 minutes to a scoreless tie on Sunday afternoon...Freshman goalkeeper **Toba Bolaji (Vaughn, Ontario)** tallied a season-best and career-high 11 saves - including four in OT - to preserve his fourth clean sheet of the season against the Mountaineers...The 11 stops are the sixth-most in a game at RMU, while the four shutouts are the fifth-best mark in the NEC...Next up for the Colonials is their 2009 home finale against Bryant at 1:00 pm on Nov. 1.

#### **Sacred Heart (6-6-2, 3-3-1 NEC • Ranked 9th in NSCAA North Atlantic Region)**

Following a tie and a loss last week, the Pioneers sit at 6-6-2 overall and 3-3-1 in NEC play...Wednesday's 1-1 double overtime draw at Army marked SHU's final nonconference tilt of 2009 before Bryant earned a 1-0 league victory over SHU on Friday...Sophomore **Alex Fait (Ottawa, Canada)** completed the week with 10 saves, including seven stops against the Bulldogs...Offensively, senior forward **Jesper Fredriksson (Gothenburg, Sweden)** scored the Pioneers' lone goal against the Black Knights when he deposited a close-range shot off of a corner kick service from **Nemanja Filimonovic (Belgrade, Serbia)** in the 80th minute...The marker was Fredriksson's second of the season, while the assist was the second for Filimonovic as he leads the squad with six points (two goals, two assists) so far this year...The Pioneers complete a New York road swing with games against St. Francis (NY) on Oct. 30 and Long Island on Nov. 1.

#### **St. Francis (NY) (8-5-1, 5-1-1 NEC • Ranked 5th in NSCAA North Atlantic Region)**
