# Colonials

NEC Predicted Finish: 2nd

2005-06 Record: 15-14, 10-8 NEC

If experience means anything, then Robert Morris should emerge as one of the favorites in the NEC this season. The Colonials return four of the top-20 scorers in the conference from a year ago. Senior forward A.J. Jackson ranked second in the league with 17.0 ppg, while sophomore guard Jeremy Chappell was tenth with 14.1 ppg. They are joined by junior guard Tony Lee (12.6 ppg) and senior guard Derek Coleman (11.9 ppg). No other NEC team brings back more than two players who scored in double-digits in 2005-06.



After four years of steady progress under Mark Schmidt, **Robert Morris** has something new to deal with: heightened expectations. After reaching the NEC semifinals for the second time in the last three seasons, RMU's top four point producers - a quartet that accounted for nearly three-quarters of the team's scoring a year ago - return for a Colonial team that features a little of everything as it seeks to bring home its first NEC title since 1991-92.

Schmidt's troops are not only fleet afoot in transition, but can also grind it out in the halfcourt with terrific three-point shooters and players who can take it to the hoop. The most acclaimed of the group is senior forward A.J. Jackson. The basketball equivalent of a five-tool player, Jackson took center stage in his first season at Robert Morris in 2005-06, finishing first in the NEC in double-doubles (14), second in scoring (17.0 ppg) and third in rebounding (9.2 rpg) en-route to first team all-conference accolades. A force in-and-around the basket, the 6'6" 230 lb. Jackson can also beat defenders off the dribble and surprised many around the league with his ability to sink the three, hitting 41.2 percent of his shots from downtown.

Schmidt also has the luxury of returning all three members of his backcourt, beginning with senior point guard Derek Coleman. Coleman (11.9 ppg) flourished as a team leader last season, and along with his ability to get his teammates involved - he led the league with 4.7 apg - he is also a clutch free throw shooter and outstanding long range bomber who finished the year third in the NEC with 74 treys and a 42.3 percent success rate from beyond the arc. A two-year starter, junior Tony Lee measures just 6'0" tall, but is a dominant force on the boards. Last season, Lee averaged a whopping 7.1 rpg to rank sixth on the circuit, while also contributing 12.6 ppg, 3.4 apg and 1.9 spg (second in NEC).

With the aforementioned trio of veterans the Colonials would be considered a strong contender in the conference. Throw in 2005-06 NEC Rookie of the Year Jeremy Chappell into the mix, and suddenly the Robert Morris faithful have every reason to pack the Sewall Center, where the Colonials were an impressive 11-2 last season. The 6-3 guard led all NEC freshman in scoring (14.1 ppg), rebounding (5.7 rpg), steals (1.9 spg), three-point percentage (.396) and blocks (0.9 bpg), and ranked second in three pointers (53). A prodigious talent who is equally adept at both ends of the floor, Chappell also finished in the NEC top-15 in each of the aforementioned categories. He also proved he wasn't afraid to take the big shot when he buried a trifecta with 12.3 seconds left to lift his team to a 67-66 road win over Mount St. Mary's in the NEC quarterfinals.

Filling a sixth man role for the Colonials last season was 6'7 forward Colson Senat. A junior, Senat is another inside-outside player who averaged 4.6 ppg and hit 22 three-point shots. The return of 6'9", 245 lb. center Freddie Harris, who sat out most of his junior year with injuries, will allow Jackson to move back to his natural position at power forward. Harris registered 6.2 ppg and 3.2 rpg before going down five games into the season.

If one of Schmidt's goals in the offseason was to add some size to the lineup, consider the mission accomplished. He inked Aaron Agnew, a 6'10", 350 lb. center who played one season at Iowa State before transferring to Highland CC, along with 7'0" shot blocker Bas Rozendaal, who hails from Holland and competed at the Massanutten Military Academy a year ago. Schmidt also signed Dallas Green, a 6'8" forward with shooting range, and 6'10" forward Ifeanyi Ehirim, who transferred from Birmingham Southern when the school dropped its classification from Division I to Division III. The final piece of his recruiting class was 5'10" guard Jimmy Langhurst, a prolific high school scorer who averaged 32.3 ppg as a senior and finished his high school career with 2,199 points, which ranks him 18th all-time in the state of Ohio.

## A.J. Jackson

After transferring from East Tennessee State, **Jackson** emerged as a dominant force in the NEC last season. Jackson, a first team all-NEC honoree who tied for the NEC lead with 14 double-doubles, finished second in the league in scoring (17.0 ppg) and third in rebounding (9.2 rpg). The 6'6", 230 lb. native of Monessen, PA also drained 33 three-pointers, showing a deft touch from the outside. If Jackson can finish the 2006-07 year as the league leader in both scoring and rebounding, he would be the first player to turn the trick since Long Island's Joe Griffin, who tallied 25.8 ppg and 8.2 rpg en-route to NEC Player of the Year honors in 1994-95.

## Mark Schmidt

Schmidt has led Robert Morris to winning NEC records in four of his first five years as head coach at the school. Only two other league programs (Monmouth & Wagner) have finished over .500 in league play at least four times in that span. Prior to his arrival, the Colonials had registered just two winning seasons in the previous seven years.

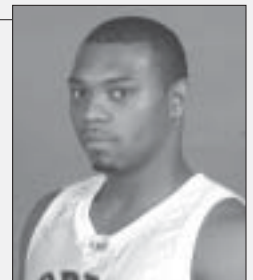

## Five Questions With: Tony Lee



### As a 6'0" guard, to what do you attribute your extraordinary rebounding prowess?

I just try to go to the boards hard and use my strength and athletic ability to grab rebounds. I attack the rebound as hard as I can, and hopefully I can get it. If you hit the boards every time, you're bound to get a few, and I'm one of those guys that enjoys getting physical in trying to grab rebounds.

It's great that coaches recognize you as one of the top teams in the Northeast Conference, but there's a downside to it because you can't let down in any game. ### How does it feel starting in the same backcourt with high school teammate Derek Coleman?

It's been great. Since we know each other very well and have been friends for so long, we know what each other's strengths are. We're always on the same page. He helps me and I help him, and we both feel it's our job to help lead this team and point it in the right direction toward winning a Northeast Conference championship.

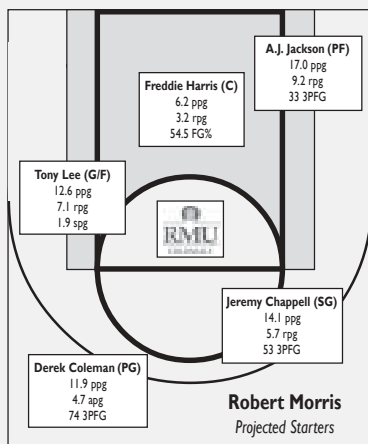

## Derek Coleman

One of the true floor generals in the conference, Coleman is the straw that stirs the drink for the potent Colonial offensive attack. The 5'11" point guard excels as a playmaker (at least five assists in 10-of-18 league games), shooter (at least two three-pointers in 22 games) and scorer (double figures in 11 of the last 13 games of the season). His ability to carry the team when necessary was evident last season when he posted 26 points on 5-6 shooting from beyond the arc in a 90-85 win over Quinnipiac on Dec. 10, then followed with a career-high 31 point performance on 6-7 shooting from long range in a 97-85 victory over Charleston Southern on Dec. 17.

# Pioneers

NEC Predicted Finish: 9th

2005-06 Record: 11-17, 8-10 NEC

Sacred Heart was the big winner in the NEC Most Improved sweepstakes a year ago, going from four wins in 2004-05 to 11 wins in 2005-06. The Pioneers' seven-game improvement was the biggest year-to-year jump for the program since a seven-game leap from ten victories in 1993-94 to 17 in 1994-95.



**Sacred Heart** took some important steps last season as it continues to reshape its program. The Pioneers secured a quality non-conference road win over eventual America East champion Albany, played Boston College and Miami tight until the final minutes, increased their season win total by seven and secured a spot in the NEC Tournament for the first time since 2001-02.

Much of the credit to the resurgence can be attributed to the breakout season by first team all-NEC center Kibwe Trim, who led the league in scoring as the Sacred Heart offense revolved around feeding the post. This season, with the 6'11" Trim gone, the Pioneers' fortunes under 29th year head coach Dave Bike will depend largely on getting the ball to a corps of perimeter sharpshooters and establishing scoring opportunities for senior Jarrid Frye.

The guard-oriented offense will feature Frye, who last year ranked fourth in the NEC with 16.1 ppg and ninth with 6.4 rpg. The lanky 6'4" wing player is one of the most complete players in the conference - a slasher with a mid-range game, great court vision and a willingness to mix it up on the boards.

Complementing Frye in the backcourt are returning starters Tavio Hobson and Drew Shubik, along with key reserve Luke Granato. In his first year manning the point, Hobson proved to be an able floor leader, finishing sixth on the circuit with 4.1 apg, while also contributing 6.3 ppg and 24 shots from beyond the arc. The senior also established himself as a terrific on-the-ball defender and led the conference with 2.1 spg. The 6'4" Shubik and the 6'6" Granato, both juniors, possess great size for the position and limitless range on their shots, finishing the 2005-06 season with 38 and 42 trifectas, respectively. Shubik ranked third on the squad with 8.6 ppg, and also ended the year in the NEC top-15 in assists (3.2 apg) and steals (1.2 spg). Granato, who came off the bench to hit seven three-pointers in a win over Saint Francis (PA) last January, averaged 6.5 ppg and was the team's best free throw shooter (93.1 percent) a year ago.

Perhaps the key to the Pioneers' good fortune this season is the return of a healthy Joey Henley at power forward. Henley, a three-sport athlete, suffered a knee injury playing football last fall and missed the entire basketball season after undergoing two operations. Named to the all-NEC second team after averaging 12.3 ppg and 5.3 rpg in 2004-05, the 6'5", 225 lb. Henley can be classified as both a rugged competitor and superior natural athlete who will be the team's top interior scoring option as he works his way back into playing shape.

Also returning up front are a pair of juniors in 6'7" Brice Brooks and 6'5" Ryan Howard. Brooks (3.7 ppg, 3.8 rpg) gives the Pioneers a physical presence inside who can also step out and sink the 12 to 15 foot jumper, while Howard (2.3 ppg) is another outstanding athlete and leaper who should only improve as he continues to refine his game. Sophomore center Liam Potter, a true seven-footer, showed promise in limited time last season.

In the offseason, Bike added to his stockpile in the backcourt by inking local recruits Chauncey Hardy and Ryan Litke. The 6'0" Hardy did not play as a senior at Xavier, but was selected all-state as a junior. Litke was tabbed all-state last season competing for Windsor. In the late signing period, Bike picked up 6'5" small forward Joshua Marshall, who averaged a double-double in helping Woodmere Academy to the New York State Class A Federation Championship Game.

## Jarrid Frye

Frye's numbers showed near across-the-board improvement last season en-route to his second team all-NEC selection at year's end. The sinewy swingman from Maspeth, NY raised his scoring (8.9 ppg to 16.1 ppg), rebounding (3.8 rpg to 6.4 rpg) and steals (1.5 spg to 1.8 spg) averages, and boosted both his field goal percentage (.439 to .449) and free throw percentage (.541 to .671). In addition, his eleven 20+ point outings last season ranked him second in the conference and are the most of any returning NEC player. Frye and former teammate Kibwe Trim combined for 24 games of 20+ points in 2005-06.

## Five Questions With: Tavio Hobson



### 1. You have built a reputation as a tough defender. What makes a good defensive player?

I love basketball, and enjoy the game in any form - from pick-up to professional. Having said that, I don't attempt to model my game after any one individual, but rather try to watch techniques and pick-up habits that good players possess.

### 5. Three players on the Sacred Heart roster hail from the state of Washington. If you could go back and play one team from your home state, who would it be and why?

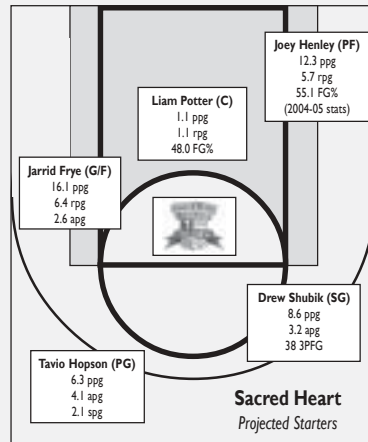

Hobson scored a career-high 14 points on 5-9 shooting from the floor and added six assists, three steals and two rebounds. The Seattle, WA native would go on to lead the NEC with 2.1 steals per game and rank sixth in assists with 4.1 per contest.





# St. Francis (NY)

# Terriers

NEC Predicted Finish: 8th

2005-06 Record: 10-17, 7-11 NEC

St. Francis (NY) has finished above .500 at home in each of the last ten seasons, by far longest streak in the NEC. The Terriers have posted an 86-31 record over the decade at the Pope Center, a 73.5 percent success rate. Robert Morris, which has posted a winning record at home the last five seasons, maintains the second-longest current streak in the conference.



In his first year manning the sidelines at **St. Francis (NY)**, head coach Brian Nash was determined to implement a new system, one that placed an emphasis on half court defense and execution within a set offense. To that end, the Brooklyn native spent nearly an entire season mixing and matching lineups and adjusting on the fly in order to find the right combination of players to carry out his game plans. Over the course of the campaign, Nash started 12 players, employed 15 different starting lineups and featured a rotation with 11 players averaging at least 13 minutes per contest.

A loss on the final day of the regular season cost the Terriers a playoff spot and snapped a streak of 15 consecutive NEC Tournament appearances. In the end, the 2005-06 season was defined by flashes of brilliance (wins over Fairfield and Fordham), tempered by spurts of inconsistency, especially on the offensive end of the floor where St. Francis averaged just 63.7 ppg.

While a lucrative recruiting haul should provide the impetus for a quick turnaround, the Terriers have a number of building blocks already in place, starting with former NEC Rookie of the Year Allan Sheppard, a junior swingman. The sinewy slasher and underrated offensive rebounder paced St. Francis in scoring a year ago with 11.6 ppg, snared 4.8 rpg and shot nearly 50 percent from the floor. Sheppard finished last season on a high note, scoring in double digits in 12 of the last 13 games, while hitting at a 55.8 percent clip from the field.

Nash often went with one of the league's quickest lineups last season with 5'8" starting point guard Jamaal Womack joining Sheppard on the court. Womack (5.9 ppg), a junior, is not only a rocket in transition, but takes care of the ball (just 44 turnovers) and can step out to three-point range (24 treys). Junior Ruandy Melo (4.4 ppg) gives Nash depth at the position.

The Terriers will not lack for size in the interior with the return of junior forward James St. Robert, sophomore forward John Gooden and junior forward Sami Pekkola. The 6'8", 230 lb. St. Robert started 18 games last year, averaging 5.9 ppg. A back-to-the basket player, he led the squad with 23 blocks and a 53.9 percent success rate from the floor. Gooden should be more of a focal point in 2006-07 after a promising freshman season that included a double-double in a late-season game against Monmouth. A bruising 6'6", 220 lbs., Gooden compiled 4.1 ppg and 3.2 rpg in limited time. Pekkola, a 6'7" Finnish import, is a designated long range marksman with deep range. He hit 15 shots from outside the arc as a sophomore and averaged 3.9 ppg.

Nash, who built a strong reputation as a recruiter in his 12 years as an assistant coach, pounded the pavement in the offseason with the end result being a six-man recruiting class that filled a number of holes for the Terriers. Former high school teammates at powerhouse St. Anthony's in Jersey City, Otis Campbell and Marcus Williams could be the backcourt of the future for St. Francis. The 6'2" Campbell, who transferred from Hutchinson CC, brings a reputation as a perimeter shooter who should help ease the losses of Christian Brown and Sean Dantzler, who combined for 93 three-pointers last season. Williams played at Globe CC in 2005-06 and is a versatile performer who at 6'3" may even see some time at forward. Freshman forward David Burton, out of the Philadelphia scholastic ranks, measures 6'5" and will likely earn time as a wing performer, while Arizona Western CC transfer Robert Hines is an athletic 6'5" power forward and Rain Rickards is a 6'5" swingman. Bass Yessoufou, a 6'9" center, hails from the Ivory Coast and played last season for Palm Beach CC.

## Allan Sheppard

After getting off to a bit of a slow start in his sophomore campaign, **Sheppard** began to heat up once conference play rolled around in January. The 2004-05 NEC Rookie of the Year reached double digits in scoring in 12 of his last 13 games, averaging 13.5 ppg and 4.5 rpg, while shooting a blistering 55.8 percent from the floor. Sheppard, a slinky 6'5" forward who hails from New York City, always seems to save his best for neighborhood rival Long Island. In four career games against the Blackbirds, he has averaged 21.0 ppg and 5.4 rpg, while sinking 60.3 percent of his shot attempts.

## Five Questions With: Marcus Williams

Terrence Roberts from Syracuse and all of my teammates from St. Anthony's.

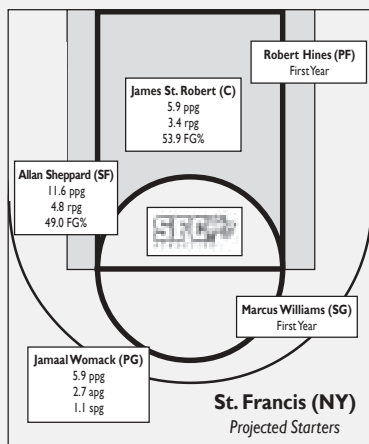

# Red Flash

NEC Predicted Finish: 11th

2005-06 Record: 4-24, 2-16 NEC

One of the most diverse teams in the conference, this year's edition of the Red Flash will feature players from seven different states (Florida, Illinois, Maryland, Nebraska, Pennsylvania, Texas and Virginia), as well as two countries (Croatia and Senegal). The young Saint Francis team features just one senior (Jelani Lawrence) and 11 underclassmen.



While starting from scratch would be somewhat of a stretch, **Saint Francis (PA)** head coach Bobby Jones has certainly undertaken a youth movement as the Red Flash look to rebound from a turbulent 2005-06 campaign that saw the Red Flash struggle to a 4-24 record.

Now in his eighth year at the helm of the program, Jones will feature a roster that includes eight first-year players and 11 underclassmen in total, many of whom will be expected to pay immediate dividends. While the newcomers will be in the spotlight, the Red Flash return a number of key veterans, the most notable being senior center J.R. Enright. A major factor in last season's struggles can be traced to Enright going down with a broken foot just prior to the start of conference play in January, an injury that sidelined the 6'10" pivotman for the remainder of the year and left Saint Francis without a true post presence. With a healthy Enright in the lineup, look for the Omaha, NE native to improve on last season's 11.9 ppg and 7.3 rpg figures.

With Enright watching in street clothes, 6'6" senior forward Jelani Lawrence was asked to play out of position and pick up much of the slack in the interior a year ago. A bouncy, mobile shot blocker type who ranked third in the conference with 36 rejections, he also contributed 10.8 ppg and 5.2 rpg while shooting 57.3 percent from the floor. With the addition of Norfolk State transfer Bassirou Dieng, a 6'9" forward who sat out last season, the Red Flash should be able to show significant improvement on the boards after finishing last in the NEC in rebound margin in 2005-06.

Jones also has to contend with two key departures in the backcourt with leading scorer Rahsaan Benton and skilled playmaker Garrett Farha lost to graduation. Sophomore Marquis Ford made the most of his opportunities as a freshman, earning a starting spot midway through the season and ending the year with his selection to the NEC all-Rookie squad. At 5'10", Ford (6.9 ppg, 2.8 apg) displayed the ability to initiate the Red Flash's half court offense, made sound decisions on the break and tossed in 26 shots from three-point range. He partnered with another first year player last season in Grant Suprenant, a long, lean 6'5" zonebuster with unlimited range. Suprenant gave notice of his abilities with a 26-point performance against nationally ranked George Washington in November, and went on to average 8.9 ppg and hit 55 shots from outside the arc.

Also returning in the backcourt is 6'5" Steve Profeta, who averaged 3.8 ppg and hit 21 trifectas as a freshman.

One of the NEC's most highly anticipated newcomers this season is Devin Sweetney, a 6'6" swingman who sat out last season and is the cousin of the Chicago Bulls' Mike Sweetney. An athletic wing player, Sweetney has the inside-outside game to make an instant impact for the Red Flash.

Jones' incoming class includes a pair of junior college transfers - Chris Berry and Kyle Jackson - who played ball together at Lon Morris CC in Texas. Berry is another swingman, who at 6'4" can guard bigger players and is explosive offensively. A 6'3" combo guard with long arms and good footwork, Jackson is projected to be a stopper on the defensive end. Along with the two transfers, the Red Flash also signed four freshmen to round out the class: Chris McFarland, a 6'0" guard, along with 6'7" Mislav Jukic, 6'8" Randy Spaid and 6'5" Kurt Hoffman, who will help fortify the frontcourt. McFarland played alongside Sweetney and Dieng at powerhouse Riverdale Baptist in Maryland. Jukic can play facing up or with his back to the basket, while Spaid, a local product who was a three-sport athlete in high school, can serve as a weapon with his ability to shoot from three-point range. Hoffman is another regional recruit, having competed scholastically in nearby Johnstown, PA.

## J.R. Enright

*Enright was en-route to a terrific junior campaign last season when a broken foot shut down the 6'10", 250 lb. center for the season in early January. Up to that point, Enright was one of the most improved players in the NEC. He had raised his scoring average from 3.7 ppg to 11.9 ppg and boosted his rebounding numbers from 1.6 rpg to 7.3 rpg. Enright, who hails from Burke, NE, posted a pair of double-doubles a year ago, including a 19-point, 17-rebound outing against Bethune-Cookman at the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic.*

### What are your impressions of the incoming recruiting class? Which players do you feel can come in and make an immediate impact?

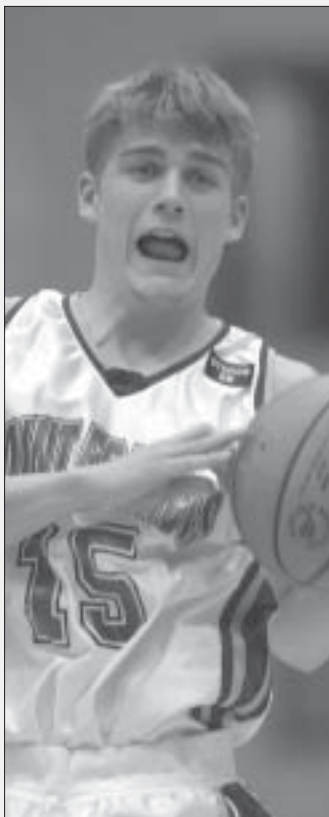

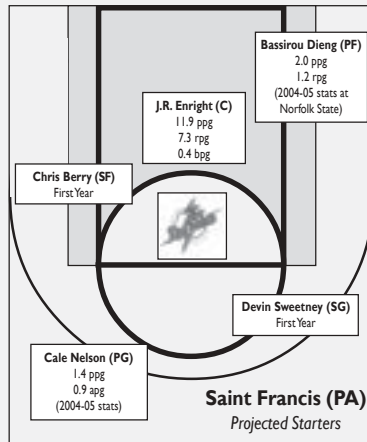

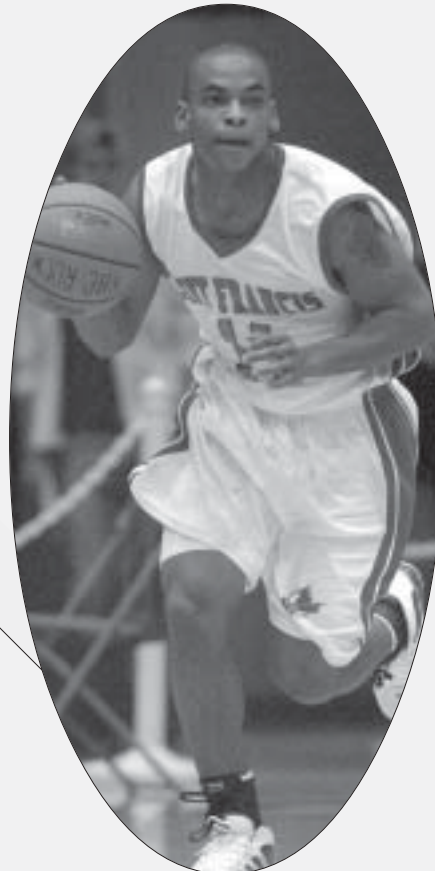

# Seahawks

NEC Predicted Finish: 6th

2005-06 Record: 13-14, 6-12 NEC

One area in which Wagner has excelled during Mike Deane's tenure as head coach is on the boards. The Seahawks have topped the NEC in rebounding margin in each of the last three years. In 2005-06, Wagner outrebounded its opponents by 4.8 per game to rank 26th nationally in the category.



**Wagner** endured the ultimate rollercoaster season in 2005-06. After tying the NEC single-season record for winning percentage in non-league play by going 7-2 - including a 63-61 win over Rhode Island and 74-72 setback to eventual NCAA runner-up UCLA - things began to unravel for the Seahawks once the conference season commenced in January. A seven-game losing streak that began in late January pushed the team to the brink of playoff elimination, and despite a strong finish that saw the Seahawks rebound to win three of their last four outings, Wagner finished on the outside looking in with respect to an NEC Tournament berth.

With three starters and eight letterwinners returning, the pendulum could quickly swing back in the other direction for a Wagner team steered by veteran head coach Mike Deane, who has compiled 383 wins in a 22-year career.

Deane, now in his fourth year at Wagner, will rely on the leadership and skills of junior guard Mark Porter to restore the Seahawks to title contention. A 6'2" guard, Porter will likely flourish as Wagner's floor leader this season following a sophomore campaign that saw him average 11.9 ppg, 3.9 rpg and 3.3 apg. A quiet assassin, Porter enjoys taking the big shot, and with 22 points in the win over URI and 19 against UCLA, has developed a well-deserved reputation for raising his level of play against top-flight competition.

Junior forward James Ulrich and sophomore guard Jamal Smith are two other returning starters who should flourish in Deane's system this season. The 6'6" Ulrich (6.3 ppg, 4.4 rpg) is a hard-nosed player in the paint who has the ability to step back and drain the mid-range jumper. Smith (8.0 ppg, 3.9 rpg) recovered from a myriad of ailments that sidelined him for nearly the entire 2004-05 season to earn NEC all-Rookie honors last season. The 6'5" athletic swingman has great size for his position and has all the tools to become a focal point of the Wagner attack.

Providing instant offense off the bench are senior forward Matt Vitale and sophomore guard Joey Mundweiler, a pair of long distance bombers who help spread the floor. Vitale averaged 6.2 ppg and drilled 39 shots from beyond the arc in 2005-06, while Mundweiler hit 41 shots from downtown and contributed 5.9 ppg.

Last year's incoming class was brought along slowly by Deane, but look for expanded roles for forwards Llewchean Radford and Doug Elwell. At 6'4", 230 lbs. Radford is both quick for his size and quick off his feet, as noted by his 3.1 rpg in limited time. Elwell is a local product with super court vision and a nice touch from the outside.

Vying for spots in Deane's rotation will be a quartet of freshman. T.J. Czeski was an all-New York State quarterback in high school who is earmarked for a role as backup point guard behind Porter with the departure of three-year starter DeEarnest McLemore. Deane also went cross country to pluck 6'7" Michael Duty out of the Washington State high school ranks. Duty, who can play either forward position, will look to earn time in the frontcourt along with 6'7" Michael Orock. Orock, out of Hoboken, NJ, is a leaper with exceptional quickness for his size. Late signee Christian Martinus Nielsen, a 6'7" native of Denmark, will see time at guard and forward and is a capable mid-range shooter.

## Mark Porter

Porter's late-game heroics have sparked Wagner to a number of victories over his first two years at Wagner, and with the graduation of running mate DeEarnest McLemore in the backcourt, look for Porter to take over more of a leadership role on a young Seahawk team in 2005-06. In leading Wagner to a 7-2 non-league record last season, Porter averaged 14.2 ppg, 3.9 apg and shot 45-52 (.865) from the charity stripe in those contests. Among his outstanding outings was a 22-point evening against UCLA, which prompted Bruins head coach Ben Howland to remark, "They're a good team. Well-coached and the guards are outstanding."

**Describe what it was like playing NCAA runner-up UCLA to the final shot last season?**

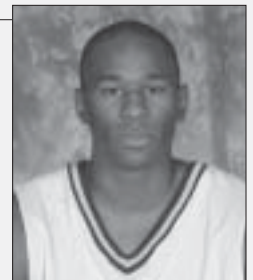

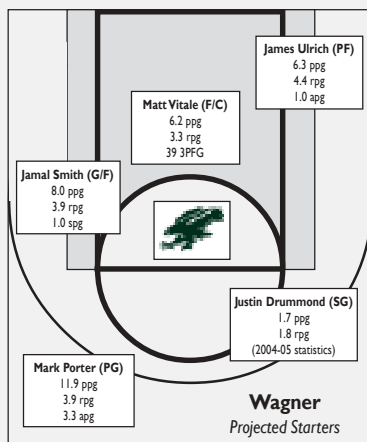

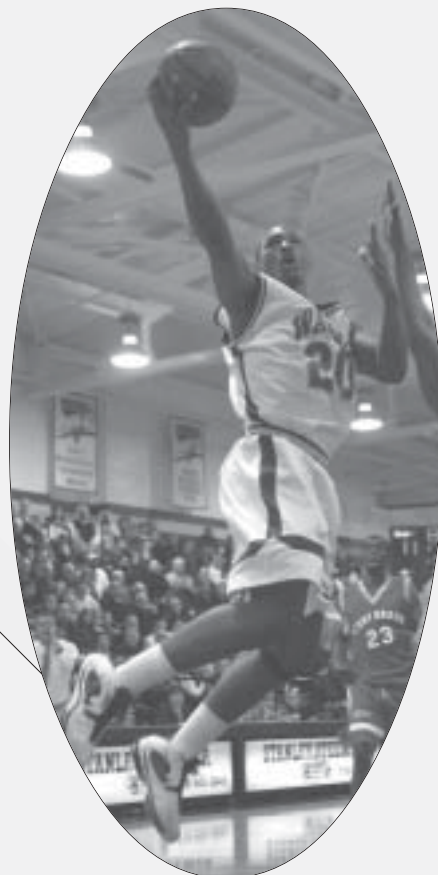

Part of the same recruiting class as Mark Porter, the 6'5" Smith has battled illness and injuries at times since arriving at Wagner, but put things together last season when he was named to the NEC's all-Rookie team. An inside-outside force, Smith displayed a glimpse of his unlimited potential when he hit for a career-high 25 points in 27 minutes - including 4-4 from outside the arc - in Wagner's 72-59 win over Brown last season.
