Sade Logan, Robert Morris

G, 6-0, Jr., Knoxville, TN/Chattanooga State

Possessing the ability to score from anywhere on the floor, the junior guard helped Robert Morris to its fourth consecutive 20-win season and produced offensive numbers never before seen in the NEC. Averaging 25.2 points per game, second-best in the nation and tops in NEC history, Logan obliterated the previous single-season school mark of 614 totals points owned by her senior teammate and fellow all-league selection Chinata Nesbit (Washington, DC/Chipola JC). Her 724 points are currently tied for the conference's all-time single-season record, which was first reached by Saint Francis (PA) Jess Zinobile. Logan, who spent much of the season on the Naismith Award Watch List, had a record year from behind the arc. She has nailed an all-time league-best 110 three-pointers while enjoying a 42.8 percent success rate.

*Choice Hotels NEC Defensive Player of the Year

Brianna Rooney, Quinnipiac

G, Jr., 5-9, Guilford, CT/Guilford

Rooney was a key player in Quinnipiac's watershed season, which has already seen a program record for wins (24) at the Division I level. The stalwart defender had much to do with the conference's top field goal percentage defense (.352). The Bobcats' leader in steals (58) brought more than just defense to the table though. A superb ball handler, Rooney owns the top assist-to-turnover ratio in the conference (1.85). Handling the ball with care, Rooney has dished out 96 total assists, which rank her seventh overall in the NEC, while turning it over only 53 times.

*Choice Hotels NEC Rookie of the Year

Alisa Apo, Sacred Heart

G, Fr., 5-9, Freehold, NJ/St. John Vianney

Apo led all rookies in scoring at 12.0 points per game while draining 42.9 percent of her three-point tries. The freshman sharpshooter came up big on numerous occasions for Swanson; none bigger than her road performance at defending champion RMU. While Sowinski spent most of her minutes in foul trouble, Apo picked up the scoring slack. The freshman poured in a then career-high 23 points in carrying the Pioneers to a 59-57 victory. Apo upped her seasonal best to 24 points one week later in a win over Fairleigh Dickinson.

NEC Women's Basketball Tournament Preview

Heading Into This Year's Tournament And Looking Back at the First 21 Affairs

After a grueling 18-game women's basketball league schedule, only eight of the conference's 11 teams still hold hope of achieving Northeast Conference supremacy. The 2008 NEC Women's Basketball Tournament *presented by ESurance* tips off this weekend at Long Island University's Wellness, Recreation, and Fitness Center in Downtown Brooklyn, NY. Breaking from the trend of the past two seasons, the quarterfinal and semifinal rounds will unfold at one predetermined site. The 2006 and 2007 installments of the NEC Women's Basketball Championship saw all games played at the home of higher seeds. The highest remaining seed after this weekend's event in Brooklyn will enjoy the luxury of hosting the NEC Tournament final on Sunday, March 16 in front of a national audience on ESPN. The title game is slated for a 3:00 pm tip-off, but plenty memorable moments will transpire before then.

The same eight teams that comprised the 2007 bracket have found their way back, but have not landed in the same place. Regardless of their seeding at this year's dance, Quinnipiac, defending tournament champion Robert Morris, Sacred Heart, Long Island, Fairleigh Dickinson, Monmouth, St. Francis (NY), and Mount St. Mary's all have an opportunity to make history and snag the conference's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

- All eight teams are at least contesting their second consecutive tournament with Mount St. Mary's currently owning the NEC's longest appearance streak. The Mount, which has reached the pinnacle here on three occasions, makes its 19th straight trip to the annual event.
- Two of Saturday's quarterfinal contests serve as grudge matches from last year's semifinal round. No. 2 Robert Morris meets seventh-seeded St. Francis (NY) 12 months after the Colonials downed the Terriers, 77-68, en route to the crown. No. 6 Monmouth looks to avenge last season's 50-46 semifinal loss to third-seeded Sacred Heart.
- Those watching Saturday's quarterfinal between St. Francis (NY) and Robert Morris will likely see NEC history made in the game's opening minutes. RMU junior guard **Sade Logan (Knoxville, TN/Chattanooga State)** needs one point to become the NEC's all-time single-season scoring leader. Currently the nation's second-leading scorer (25.2 ppg), Logan is tied with Saint Francis (PA) great Jess Zinobile (1996-2000). The former Red Flash is a three-time NEC Tournament MVP and member of the league's 25th anniversary team.
- Four players at this year's event have made prior appearances on the NEC All-Tournament Team. Robert Morris senior forward **Chinata Nesbit (Washington, DC/Chipola JC)** was the 2007 MVP following the Colonials' title run while St. Francis (NY) senior center **Katja Bavendam (Hambergen, Germany/Osterholz-Scharmbeck)** earned all tournament honors after 13 ppg and 11.5 rpg through two contests. Quinnipiac senior forward **Monique Lee (Lynn, MA/Lynn Classical)** and junior guard **Erin Kerner (Erie, PA/Mercyhurst Prep)** were all-tournament honorees during the 2006 installment when the Bobcats came up four points short of Sacred Heart in the title game.
- Despite being charter members of the league, Long Island and Fairleigh Dickinson have only met twice in tournament play prior to Saturday's quarterfinal. The Blackbirds took the more recent meeting in 2002 while the Knights clipped them in 1992.
- The NEC Tournament has been friendly to No. 1 seeds throughout the years. Long Island's upset loss last season marked the first time in tournament history that the top seed failed to advance into the semifinal round. Fairleigh Dickinson lost its opening game in 1993, but the top-seeded Knights earned a bye into the semifinals during the final year of a six-team bracket. Mount St. Mary's met the same fate as FDU two years prior when it fell to Robert Morris.
- Top seeds have won the tournament in 12 of its 21 years of existence.
- In the 14 years since the Northeast conference discontinued the six-team bracket, the No. 1 seed has won 10 times and has only twice missed the final.
- Two No. 3 seeds have captured the tournament crown with Long Island accomplishing the feat in 2001 and Fairleigh Dickinson in 1990.
- Seeded fourth in 1991, Robert Morris was the lowest seed to ever win the tournament title. The Colonials bested No. 5 Saint Francis (PA) in an opening round match-up before ousting top-seeded Mount St. Mary's to advance into the final. Wagner, seeded sixth, made its way through the lower half of the draw, but fell to RMU by a 69-61 count.
- RMU's 1991 crown was the latter of two won under former head coach Dan Swalga. The '91 Colonials are the only team to win the tournament while finishing the season with a less than .500 winning percentage (13-17).
- The tournament's champion began receiving an automatic NCAA berth in 1994 with the Mount becoming the first-ever beneficiary of that with its second of three straight title wins (1993-95)
- Saint Francis (PA) owned the NEC Tournament from 1996-2005, winning nine of a possible ten titles. The lone occasion on which the title eluded the Red Flash was in 2001 when they surprisingly failed to qualify.
- Saint Francis (PA) has the best tournament winning percentage (.886), most tournament wins (31) and most NEC Championships (9) of any conference team.
- Saint Francis (PA) will not appear in the NEC Tournament this year for the second year, but the Red Flash are currently in the midst of a 27-game tournament winning streak. intact.
- Monmouth has made it through to the semifinals more frequently than anyone in the league. The Hawks have been amongst the tournament's final four on 13 occasions.
- Only four players have earned both Tournament MVP and Player of the Year accolades in the same season. Monmouth's Linda Wilson was honored with both awards during the league's inaugural season in 1986-87, followed by Mount St. Mary's Susie Rowlyk in 1993-94 and Saint Francis (PA)'s Jess Zinobile in 1999-2000. Most recently, Amanda Pape of Sacred Heart was tabbed with both honors in 2005-06.
- Quinnipiac's Ashlee Kelly redefined "monster game" in 2004 when she poured in 38 points and grabbed 28 rebounds during a quarterfinal showdown with FDU.
- Two days after her tournament record 28-rebound performance, QU's Ashlee Kelly hauled in 26 boards against Saint Francis (PA) to claim the top two spots on the tournament's all-time list.
- The tournament has been home to a 40-point scorer on two occasions. Saint Francis (PA) great Jess Zinobile holds the single-game record for the 46 points she scored against Long Island in 2000 while fellow Red Flash Beth Swink poured in 40 points against St. Francis (NY) five years later.
- No team has ever reached the century mark in a game during tournament time. Saint Francis (PA) and Monmouth are tied for the top single-game point total (92). The Red Flash did it against Monmouth in 1994 while the Hawks scored 92 against St. Francis (NY) en route to the title.
- The largest margin of victory in a tournament game (33) came in Robert Morris' 72-39 triumph over Central Connecticut State in 2005.

Robert Morris Colonials

(22-9, 16-2 NEC)



- Robert Morris rides a 16-game win streak, currently the nation's fourth-longest, into its second consecutive NEC Tournament Final. The three-time NEC champion Colonials won it all here last year, edging Sacred Heart, 68-66, in the final.
- The Colonials downed No. 6 Monmouth, 67-52, in last Sunday's semifinal round thanks to a record performance from junior guard **Sade Logan (Knoxville, TN/Chattanooga State)**. The NEC Player of the Year tied the NEC Tournament single-mark with 15 field goals converted, set the NEC mark for three-pointers made with seven, and tied the third-highest scoring output in tournament history with 38 points.
- The Colonials defeated St. Francis (NY), 77-62, for the third time this season to advance into the semifinal round of the tournament for the fourth straight season. All-NEC first team senior forward Chinata Nesbit (Washington, DC/Chipola JC) logged a triple-double which included 24 rebounds, the third-highest single-game total in tournament history.
- **Logan's** 121 three-balls this season are a new NEC single-season mark and are only five off the NCAA record of 126 set by Lisa McMullen of Alabama State in 1991.
- Robert Morris won a combined ten games from 2000-2004, but the Colonials are now celebrating their fourth straight 20-win season.
- RMU won it all here last season, edging Sacred Heart, 68-66, in the title game before falling to fourth-seeded North Carolina State in the First Round of the NCAA Fresno Regional.
- The Colonials' current 16-game win streak, which began on Jan. 16 against FDU, is the longest achieved by an NEC team this season and a program record.
- RMU is an offensive juggernaut, amassing a conference-best 73.7 ppg while ranking second in scoring margin (+11.2 ppg). The Colonials numbers are even more crooked in NEC play. Averaging 75.6 ppg, the Colonials outscore league opponents by an average of 17.4 ppg, a figure that is nearly nine points greater than the NEC's second-ranked squad.
- Robert Morris' non-conference schedule contained dates with eight members of Division I FBS leagues, the most of any NEC team. The Colonials took on schools from the Big XII, SEC, ACC, Mid-American, Sun Belt, and Conference USA.
- **Logan** became the Colonials' single-season scoring leader and NEC record holder with 787 points this year. She surpassed Saint Francis (PA) great Jess Zinoble's 724 points (1999-2000) in the NEC annals while obliterating the previous school mark of 614 set by **Nesbit** in 2006-07.
- After amassing a league-best 17 double-doubles during her junior campaign, **Nesbit** tops all NEC players once again with 12 double-doubles.
- **Nesbit** became the first player in RMU history, and only player in the NEC this season, to record a triple-double. The 6'0" forward has two of them after amassing 18 points, 24 rebounds, and 10 assists in RMU's quarterfinal victory over St. Francis (NY) She also netted 16 points, dished out 12 assists, and grabbed 10 boards in an 87-53 victory over Mount St. Mary's (Feb. 25).
- In addition to notching the triple-double against the Mount, Nesbit became the 16th player in program history to score 1,000 career points on the same day.
- **Nesbit** is the ninth player in Colonials' history to accumulate 1,000 points and 500 rebounds.

Long Island Blackbirds

- Long Island make its first title game appearance since 2002 when the Blackbirds succumbed to Saint Francis (PA). 74-54. The Blackbirds won their only NEC title the year before, downing Mount St. Mary's, 70-61, in the final.
- The Blackbirds pieced together the NEC's second-longest win streak this season, winning nine straight games from November 23 (Youngstown State) through December 30 (UNLV).
- Long Island ousted the tournament's top seed in the semifinal round, downing Quinnipiac, 67-63.
- Avenging last year's quarterfinal upset loss to St. Francis (NY), Long Island
- The Blackbirds have been amongst the NEC Tournament's final four on five occasions since 2001.
- Prior to its current run, Long Island last advanced past the quarters by knocking off Monmouth in 2006 before succumbing to eventual champion Sacred Heart in its semifinal matchup.
- The Blackbirds were this year's NEC preseason favorite, receiving six first-place votes in a poll of the league's head coaches.
- Head coach **Stephanie V. Gaitley** is one of two current NEC coaches with more than 400 career victories to her credit, the other is her opponent on Sunday.
- **Gaitley**, who spent 15 seasons at the helm of current Atlantic 10 members Saint Joseph's and Richmond prior to her arrival at LIU in 2002, reached the 400-win mark this season with the Blackbirds' triumph over Wagner on February 4.
- Long Island led the conference in field goal percentage defense for the second consecutive year. The Blackbirds have become even stingier this season, surrendering only 53.4 ppg compared to the league-low 56.4 ppg opponents scored on them last season.
- Sophomore guard **Valerie Nainima (Suva, Fiji/St. Joseph's Secondary)** reached the 20-point mark 18 times this season, second-most occasions in the league. The Fijian guard tallied 30-point nights during two of those 18 prime performances.
- Nainima and senior center Sara Oblak both registered their 1,000th career point this season. Nainima became the fastest Blackbird to the millenium mark, doing so through her first 53 collegiate contests.
- Sophomore guard **Connie James (Galloway, NJ/Absegami)** is second on the team to Nainima in assists (90) and steals (49).
- Freshman forward **Chelsi Johnson (Egg Harbor Twp., NJ/Holy Spirit)**, whose hometown is in the vicinity of James', has increased the South Jersey production flow that has been making its way into downtown Brooklyn, averaging 7.1 ppg and 7.6 rpg.

Always More to Know...

Six Short of NCAA History

Sade Logan, the 2008 NEC Player of the Year, stands six three-point field goal makes short of solely possessing the all-time NCAA single-season record. Already having surpassed the previous Northeast Conference record of 108 made by Long Island's Kim MacMillan in 2001, Logan has 121 makes from long distance. She needs to hit five more from beyond the arc to tie Lisa McMullen's (Alabama State, 1991) mark of 126. The scoring sensation recently claimed ownership of the NEC Tournament single-game record when she sunk seven three-balls during the Colonials' semifinal round victory over Monmouth (3/9).

Missing: The No. 1 Seed

The No.1 seed had failed to reach the championship game on only five occasions during the Northeast Conference tournament's 22-year history, and two of those five years have come in back-to-back years (2007, 2008). No. 4 Long Island bounced top-seeded Quinnipiac from this year's bracket with its 67-63 semifinal round triumph. Ironically, Long Island was the victim here last season. After earning a share of the 2007 NEC regular season crown and tournament's top seed, the Blackbirds were stunned in the first round by intra-boro rival St. Francis (NY). LIU's 2007 defeat to SFNY marked the first occasion in tournament history that a No. 8 seed was responsible for a top seed's demise. Prior to the 2007 installment, only the 1999 Mount St. Mary's Mountaineers, the 1993 Fairleigh Dickinson Knights, and the 1991 Mount team could not translate its No. 1 seeding into a title game berth.

Scoring Stalemate? Something Must Give

The 2008 NEC final pits the league's top scoring defense against the No. 1 scoring offense. The high-flying Colonials score points at a blistering pace of 73.5 per game while the Blackbirds have been frustrating opposing attacks all season long to the tune of 53.7 points allowed per contest. Robert Morris, who owns the best team field goal percentage in the conference (.448), has taken the first two meetings between these sides this season, but Long Island's stingy defense kept the Blackbirds within striking distance the entire way.

The Two Lone Rangers Roam the NEC

According to a recent *Sports Illustrated* feature piece, Mount St. Mary's and Robert Morris are the only two Division I schools in the nation running a form of the dribble-drive motion offense. Only eight women's colleges in all of North America are practicing some form of the offensive scheme with RMU and MSM being the only four-year American schools to do so. From a broader perspective, *SI* found 224 total teams throughout the junior high, high school, college, and professional ranks running the offense. The story appears in the February 18, 2008 edition of the well-known sports magazine.

Harvesting Fertile Grounds of Garden State

The NEC All-Rookie Team was nearly an All-Garden State Team, but Central Connecticut State's **Kerriane Dugan (Waterford, CT/Waterford)** crashed the party. Dugan and three other New Jersey natives joined NEC Rookie of the Year **Alisa Apo (Freehold, NJ/St. John Vianney)**, a former NJ Shore Conference standout, on the all-rookie squad. Mount St. Mary's forward **Mary Dunn (Whippany, NJ/Morris Catholic)**, Fairleigh Dickinson guard **Jasmyra Saunders (Trenton, NJ/Trenton Catholic)**, and Long Island guard **Chelsi Johnson (Egg Harbor Twp., NJ/Holy Spirit)** all represented the Garden State high school hoops well during their freshmen go-rounds at the Division I level.

Fiji Phenoms

NEC preseason favorite Long Island has two of Fiji's finest in its back court. Sophomore guard **Valerie Nainima (Suva, Fiji/St. Joseph's)** and senior guard **Mikaelar Whippy (Suva, Fiji/Church College of New Zealand)** were two of the Northeast Conference's top-ten scorers last season and are also two of the best players their native land of Fiji has to offer. The two proved their merit on the international stage during this past summer's South Pacific Games, powering Fiji to a Gold medal.

Nainima averaged a tournament-high 25.7 points per game, while Whippy averaged 19.1.

In helping LIU to a share of the 2006-07 Northeast Conference regular season title, the pair combined for more than 30 points per game. Nainima ranked fifth amongst all scorers with a 17.8 ppg average, while Whippy was tenth overall at 12.7 ppg.

The two then used to scoring abilities to help Fiji roll through the international tournament. The South Pacific island posted a 7-0 record at the games, culminating in a 70-62 victory over American Samoa in the Gold medal game. Nainima netted 29 points to go along with six steals against American Samoa in the championship affair.

Four of the Northeast Conference's 11 teams welcomed new head coaches this past off-season. The four mentors come from different backgrounds, but all share the same goal of building the next NEC Champion.

A Familiar Piper Plays Again at Central Connecticut State

Beryl Piper returned to her alma mater with the hopes of returning a struggling program to the level of success she experienced as a player at CCSU. As a senior co-captain for the 1985-86 season, Piper helped the Blue Devils post a program record 24 wins. Following her playing days, Piper coached for 19 seasons at New Britain (CT) High School. She amassed 289 career wins there and ended her tenure with back-to-back Class LL State titles. She is a member of the CCSU Alumni Athletics Hall of Fame Class of 1999.

Mr. 20-20 Takes Reigns at Fairleigh Dickinson

Peter Cinella took over at FDU after an extremely successful head coaching stint at American International College that included nine 20-win seasons. Cinella became the winningest coach in program history, compiling a 291-130 record during 14 seasons of service at the D-II school. Cinella's team made nine NCAA Tournament appearances, including a trip to the 2006 championship game.

Whitten Hopes to Make The Mount Hard-hittin' again

Bryan Whitten became the fifth coach in Mount St. Mary's history this past summer after coaching stints at Virginia Commonwealth and King's College. More recently, Whitten served two years as an assistant at VCU of the Colonial Athletic Association. Prior to his time at VCU, the 1991 graduate of King's College was the head coach of his alma mater for 12 seasons. He amassed a 220-103 record during those 12 years, including a 205-69 clip during the last ten season there.

Fruchtl Focuses on Returning Tradition to Saint Francis (PA)

Susan Robinson Fruchtl is the new head coach of Saint Francis' (PA) storied program that is in its 40th season. The Red Flash have made nine NCAA Tournament appearances since 1995, but have endured two tough losing seasons of late. A 1992 graduate of Penn State, Fruchtl comes to SFFA after serving her alma mater as an assistant coach. During her playing days at Penn State, Fruchtl was a Wade Trophy Winner who helped PSU post a 29-2 record and the No. 1 AP Poll national ranking in 1990-91.

NEC Women's Basketball Championship Preview

Defending Champ Robert Morris Hosts

Preseason Favorite Long Island For Chance to Dance

Moon Township, PA -- The defending champion rides a 16-game win streak into its encounter with the preseason favorite. The 2007 NEC Player of the Year confronts the woman that dethroned her. The league's top scoring offense attempts to break the No. 1 scoring defense with an NCAA Tournament berth awaiting the victor.

Storylines are plentiful for Sunday's Northeast Conference Championship game between the home-standing Robert Morris Colonials and challenging Long Island Blackbirds, but those hoping to see the tournament's No. 1 seed will be grossly disappointed.

For the second consecutive year, the NEC will crown a tournament champion without the top seed present. Since discontinuing the six-team bracket following the 1993 tournament, only three top seeds have failed to reach the final. Prior to last year's clash between the second-seeded Colonials and No. 3 Sacred Heart, only the 1999 final lacked a top seed during the current era.

Throughout its 22-year history, the NEC Women's Basketball Tournament has been a pleasant place for top seeds. Only five No. 1 seeds have ever missed the championship round and top seeds have been the last one standing in 12 of the prior 21 years.

Seeded second once again after another share of the regular season crown, the Colonials look to capture back-to-back tournament titles.

Reigning NEC Player of the Year **Sade Logan (Knoxville, TN/Chattanooga State)**, a junior college transfer, was not in the Sewall Center when RMU claimed last year's prize, but the nation's second leader scoring is a main reason why the Colonials will be looking for a repeat on their home floor.

Only five three-pointers away from tying the all-time NCAA single-season record of 126 by Lisa McMullen of Alabama State in 1991, Logan has torched the NEC record book with an unprecedented, season-long offensive display. With a 25.4 ppg scoring average, 121 three-pointers made, and 787 total points, Logan has claimed ownership of three NEC single-season records.

"Sade's a competitor and she performed extremely well against a tough non-conference schedule. She's a high level player and I think she'll rise even higher with the opportunity to play on this stage here," said head coach Sal Buscaglia prior to the start of the 2008 NEC Tournament.

Logan has made good on her coach's words thus far. The 6'0" guard followed up a 25-point outing in a 77-62 quarterfinal victory over St. Francis (NY) with the third-highest single-game point total (38) in NEC Tournament history during a 67-52 semifinal triumph over Monmouth. Logan powered the Colonials past the Hawks by netting a tournament record seven three-pointers and tying the 21-year old mark of 15 field goals made.

Logan's stiffest test of the tournament, and arguably all season, awaits her on Sunday when she will go up against the NEC's top scoring defense.

Logan scored a combined 46 points on 20-of-33 shooting in her two regular season encounters with LIU, both eight-point Robert Morris victories, but Sunday's stakes are a lot higher.

"Our defense is right where it needs to be right now," said LIU head coach Stephanie V. Gaitley, a 22-year veteran on the sidelines. "We're playing very well right now."

Vying to become the first No. 4 seed to win it all since the 1991 Colonials, the preseason favorite Blackbirds have surrendered a league-low 53.7 points per game this season while featuring the NEC's second-leading scorer in the offensive end.

Sophomore guard **Valerie Nainima (Suva, Fiji/St. Joseph's Secondary)** became the first woman to win both the NEC Player and Rookie of the Year awards in the same season a year ago. The two-time all-NEC first team selection increased her scoring output from the 17.8 points per contest of her rookie campaign to the current 20.4 ppg clip, but missed out on a second straight Player of the Year accolade due to the emergence of Logan.

"Valerie is having an even better year than last if that's possible," exclaimed Gaitley, who notched her 400th career coaching victory on February 4 at Wagner.

Nainima, whose return to the LIU lineup was undoubtedly a factor in the Blackbirds' No. 1 preseason ranking, propelled her team to a 13-5 NEC regular season mark and has not slowed down this postseason. The 5'5" Fijian guard, who averages 5.7 rebounds and 3.3 assists per game, made certain the Blackbirds avoided a second consecutive first round upset by tallying 20 points and nine rebounds in a 64-53 quarterfinal victory over fifth-seeded Fairleigh Dickinson. Next, she poured in 23 points to thwart top-seeded Quinnipiac, 67-63, and propel the Blackbirds into their first tournament title game since 2002.

Long Island last won a championship game in 2001 when they conquered Mount St. Marys (70-61), and if that is to change on Sunday it will have as much to do with Nainima as it does with her strong supporting cast.

"We're getting different kids contributing on different nights," said Gaitley.

Fighting through a season-long shoulder ailment, LIU senior guard **Mikaelar Whippy (Suva, Fiji/Church College of New Zealand)** is averaging 11 points and five rebounds per game this tournament and has sunk 10-of-15 shots.

After earning NEC All-Rookie honors, LIU freshman forward **Chelsi Johnson (Egg Harbor Twp., NJ/Holy Spirit)** further elevated her game when the calendar changed to March. The 6'0" versatile forward, who has made 11-of-20 shot attempts during the first two postseason games of her career, opened the tournament with 19 points and six rebounds against the Knights. Next, she posted a double-double of 12 points and 14 boards to sink the No. 1 Bobcats while connecting on two momentum-changing three-pointers.

"Chelsi is peaking at the right time and is gaining confidence in the offense. She's obviously a tremendous rebounder, but she's a good defender as well," admired Gaitley.

The Colonials' high-flying attack, which scores 73.5 ppg, features two-time first team all-conference forward **Chinata Nesbit (Washington, DC/Chipola JC)**. An all-around complete player, the veteran forward, who has a league-best 12 double-doubles, enters the title bout off her triple-double performance of 18 points, 24 rebounds, and 10 assists in last Saturday's quarterfinal.

Fourteen of the 24 rebounds came on the offensive glass where junior guard **Angela Pace (Westchester, NY/Woodlands)** collected nine of her 17 boards that game.

"I felt like we just needed to step up," said Nesbit of her and Pace's combined rebounding effort that totaled 10 more boards than the entire St. Francis (NY) team. "We just wanted to do what we needed to win. If that's rebound, then that's what we'll do."

Buscaglia, who has engineered a renaissance at Robert Morris after taking over a team that won a combined seven games in the three seasons prior to his arrival, notes the importance of seasoned veteran **Kendra Williams (Bronx, NY/Mount Saint Ursula)** and **Psyche Butler (Fort Worth, TX/New Mexico JC)**.

Butler, who is regarded by Buscaglia as a top defender, missed the first two tournament games due to a concussion suffered in the regular season finale, but is day-to-day. Williams, who averages 7.7 points per contest, is one of only two Colonials to start all 31 games.

"Butler and Kendra hold are team together," said Buscaglia, who is nearing the 600-win mark. "Their leadership and experience give us a great core. We have talent and core leadership that will hopefully carry us."

So, the week-long hiatus between last weekend's tournament games and the title bout is nearing a close. The stage is set. The leading roles are in place and the supporting casts are strong.

Two marquee players, two well-accomplished coaches, and two of the NEC's top teams will all be on hand at the Sewall Center, but only one will be dancing in the finale.

The 2008 Northeast Conference Championship Game *presented by ESurance* tips off at 3:00 pm on Sunday, March 16. The 22nd annual NEC title game will be available to a national television audience on ESPNU.
